Whittaker gets new assignment

OLYMPIA, Wash. (UPI) — The first American to conquer Mt. Everest, James Whittaker of Redmond, Wash., Thursday was handed a governmental assignment which could prove as tough as the world's highest mountain.

Gov. Albert D. Rosellini appointed Whittaker, 34, to the State Parks Commission, succeeding Joseph S. Whitting of Seattle who resigned last January.

Whittaker joins the often turbulent commission at a time when it is attempting to name a new director to replace Clayton Anderson who resigned under pressure from Rosellini.

The new commissioner said he had not yet had a chance to review the five candidates still in the running for the \$12,000-a-year job. But he said he hoped to do so soon.

Plans approved for hospital

KLAMATH FALLS (UPI) — The Department of Health, Education and Welfare has approved the plans and specifications for the new Presbyterian Intercommunity Hospital here, hospital officials were informed Thursday.

The action by the federal agency clears the way for allocation of \$1,333,000 in Accelerated Public Works and Hill-Burton Act funds for construction of the hospital.

Ground-breaking ceremonies are scheduled Saturday with Rep. Al Ullman, D-Ore., in attendance. Todd Construction Co., Roseburg, was the low bidder on the project at \$2,000,000.

More than \$1 million has been pledged locally.

Dean is found guilty by jury

KLAMATH FALLS (UPI) — A Klamath County Circuit Court jury found John Wesley Dean, 57, guilty of second degree murder after two hours of deliberation Thursday.

Dean was accused in the fatal stabbing of his brother, Hagan, 37, here July 22. Hagan Dean died five days later.

Judge Donald A. W. Piper set sentencing for Monday. The jury voted 11-1 for the verdict.

Council names Yturri president

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (UPI)

—The Western Conference of the Council of State Governments concluded its 1963 meeting Thursday by naming Cheyenne, Wyo., as the site of next year's meeting and State Sen. Anthony Yturri of Oregon next year's president.

Yturri, who was unable to attend the conference, succeeds former Colorado Sen. Charles E. Bennett as president.

Rep. Charles Welch, speaker of the Utah House of Representatives was elected vice president. He succeeds Yturri in that job.

Several resolutions were passed, including one which called on the federal government to observe water rights obtained under state laws. This resolution asks Congress to "enact legislation which will declare unmistakably that water rights are a species of real property rights which should be acquired and maintained like other forms under the laws of the respective states."

It also called for passage of a bill now pending which would require federal agencies to conform to state water laws.

Plea is entered for Unsworth

KLAMATH FALLS (UPI) — A plea of innocent of second degree murder was entered in Klamath County Circuit Court Thursday on behalf of Bill Unsworth of Klamath Falls.

The plea was entered after Unsworth remained silent in his court appearance.

He was originally charged with first degree murder in the shooting of Tony Moore here in January, 1962. A jury found him guilty of second degree murder last year, but an appeal resulted in the Oregon Supreme Court ordering a new trial.

The trial is scheduled to start Nov. 18.
