

UW, USC in scramble for Rose Bowl bid

The scramble for the Rose Bowl could end as early as Saturday in Seattle when ninth-ranked Southern California rams into the Washington Huskies.

Listed as the first "crucial" of the season in Big Six action, it also might be the last one in a game featuring two teams that have grown hot after unimpressive starts. The rest of the league is struggling.

USC, a six-point favorite, owns a 1-0 mark in the conference and is 4-2 for the season. The Trojans opened defense of the Big Six crown last Saturday by brushing off California, 36-6.

Washington has won three straight after dropping its first three. The Huskies, also 1-0 in the conference, once more can count on fullback Junior Coffey to whack into the Trojan line. He scored twice in last week's

win over Oregon after being pronounced out for the season because of a broken foot.

Bears Bruins Vie
Although USC shares the Big Six lead with Southern Cal and Washington, the Bruins host California Saturday night in what is listed as a battle of have-nots. The green Uclians have lost five out of six this year while California is 2-3-1 and 0-2 in the Big Six.

In other games, Stanford invades Oregon State, Washington State is at Idaho, San Jose State at Oregon, San Diego State at Fresno State and the San Diego Marines at the University of the Pacific.

UCLA rates a six-point choice over Cal's Bears who may not have Roger Foster, their star tackle, off the injured list. The Bruins are expected to go with a backfield, led by quarterback Larry Zeno, which made second-ranked Illinois scramble to win 18-12 last Friday.

Stanford, although in the Big Six cellar with two losses in as many conference games, upset Notre Dame last week and is gunning to do the same thing to Oregon State. The Beavers may have been softened up by a 31-8 pasting at Syracuse last Saturday but are four-point choices over the redmen.

Washington State, blanked by classy Army 23-0 last Saturday, is a seven-point choice to bounce back against fast-rising Idaho. Coach Dee Andros' Vandals thumped San Jose State, 28-12, on the same day and have won four out of six to spark a gridiron revival after years of being losers.

Arch Kingsley 'not optimistic' about Beavers

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI)—President Arch Kingsley of the Portland baseball club is "not very optimistic" about the Beavers' future.

The Kansas City Athletics Wednesday canceled "with regret" their working agreement with Portland. The Beavers also are not certain of a place to play next season because Multnomah Stadium where they normally perform is for sale.

Portland's future in the PCL probably will be decided at the minor league meetings in San Diego Dec. 1-3.

"I don't know where we can go from here. All we can do right now is sit tight and see what the majors decide to do," Kingsley said.

San Jose shifts grid lineup

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UPI)—Second string tackle Don Anderson Tuesday was dropped from the San Jose State team for disciplinary reasons.

Coach Bob Titchener would not elaborate on the incident.

End Bob Davis was promoted from third to first string. He thus became the fourth soph to crack the Spartan starting eleven.

OSU, Stanford take turns knocking each other off

CORVALLIS (UPI)—Oregon State and Stanford, a couple of football teams that have a habit of upsetting each other, collide here Saturday with the hometown Beavers slight favorites.

Despite the resurgent Indians' 24-14 victory over Notre Dame and Oregon State's 31-8 drubbing by Syracuse last week, odds-makers favor Oregon State by four points.

Two years ago a slightly favored Oregon State eleven was drubbed by Stanford here 35-0. That, incidentally, was the last time the Beavers have lost a game at Corvallis. They've won

Portland St., L&C teams go for titles

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI)—Portland State goes after its Oregon Collegiate Conference title and Lewis and Clark clinch at least a tie for the Northwest Conference crown in small college football games Saturday.

Portland State closes its OCC schedule against Oregon College of Education in a Homecoming at Mommouth Saturday afternoon.

A loss to the Wolves would force Portland State to share the title with Southern Oregon, which is host to Chico State in a non-conference game at Ashland.

Winless Eastern Oregon closes out its OCC schedule against Oregon Tech in a game at La Grande.

In the Northwest Conference, undefeated Lewis and Clark takes on Whitman at Walla Walla, while Willamette travels to College of Idaho and Pacific is at Linfield in the only night game.

Post may get Alabama trial in Butts muddle

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (UPI)—A federal district judge ruled Thursday that the Saturday Evening Post could receive a fair trial here in Alabama Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant's \$10-million libel suit.

Judge H. Hobart Grooms said Curtis Publishing Co. did not present a "strong enough case of adverse publicity" for a ruling that an unbiased jury could not be found in the state.

Bryant filed the suit on the basis of a Post article, "The Story of a College Football Fix" which said former Georgia Athletic Director Wallace Butts gave him game secrets before the 1962 Alabama-Georgia game.

Curtis, which publishes the Post, claimed that the trial should be moved outside the state.
