Federal land in Oregon mapped by OSU

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY — The 51 per cent of the land of Oregon that is owned by the federal government has been charted on a first-of-its-kind map for the state by an Oregon State University graduate student in the Department of Natural Resources.

Twenty-one federal agencies own 31,915,902 acres of Oregon's 61,641,600 acre total, the study notes. County percentages range from 74 per cent in Malheur and Deschutes counties to 1 per cent in Clatsop county.

William B. Carolan made the study under the direction of Dr. Richard M. Highsmith, professor of natural resources and geography.

On the map prepared by Carolan, the location and distribution of federal land in Oregon is pinpointed by agency. It is one of the first studies that brings together data on federal land in Oregon.

The Bureau of Land Management owns the most acres in Oregon, 15,937,354, closely followed by the U.S. Forest Service with 15,001,833 acres. Together, they have about 93 per cent of the federal land in Oregon.

Other federal agencies that have substantial acreages in Oregon include: Fish and Wildlife Service, 444,024 acres; Bureau of Reclamation, 173,447; National Park Service, 160,876; Navy, 98,645; Corps of Engineers, 59,472.

Church proposal to decentralize authority scored

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—A plan to decentralize authority in the Roman Catholic Church today came under fire from both liberals and conservatives at the Ecumenical Council.

Questions even were raised about the legitimacy of the procedure by which the plan was drafted for submission to the council fathers.

At issue in the sharpest debate thus far in the council's 1963 session is a document entitled "Of Bishops and the Government of Dioceses."

It says that bishops should be given greater freedom to run their own dioceses without having to consult the Roman Curia on many routine administrative matters. It also would grant official recognition and real legislative powers to national conferences of bishops, such as the U.S. National Catholic Welfare Conference (NCWC).

Under present church laws, these conferences can only make recommendations, which are not binding on any individual bishop who chooses to ignore them.

Conservative prelates view the document with alarm because they regard any decentralization of authority as a threat to the primacy of the pontiff.

Liberals are unhappy because the language of the document seems to imply that the additional power to be exercised by bishops would be merely delegated by the Pope, rather than inherent in the office of the bishop.

They feel that this is a subtle retreat from the important theological principle which the council established in the first session: that bishops are successors of the original 12 apostles and have a "divine right" to share with the Pope in the government of the church.

Finally, both liberals and conservatives feel that the document is entirely too vague in defining how far national episcopal conferences could go in making rules binding on all bishops in a given country.

Monday, November 11, Veteran's Day will be a holiday for the students in the Sisters schools.

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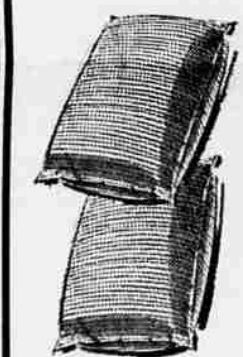
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
