

## Russians may again try to put new controls on Allied convoys

BERLIN (UPI) — The East German Communists indicated today the Russians again may attempt to impose new controls on Western Allied convoys traveling on the Berlin highway.

The official East German Communist party newspaper Neues Deutschland, in an attack on American "arrogance and stubbornness," said "the autobahn of the (East) German Democratic Republic is no paradise for provocateurs and troublemakers."

It made the statement in an attempt to justify the 41-hour blockade of a Berlin-bound U.S. Army convoy at a Soviet checkpoint because the American soldiers refused to leave their trucks to be counted.

A small U.S. convoy of 22 men in 10 vehicles was sent into Berlin from West Germany without incident today.

**Passed Quickly**  
The Russians quickly passed it through checkpoints at each end of the 110-mile highway to

Berlin. No trouble had been expected because the Russians never have asked such small convoys to dismount to be counted, and they did not today.

It was considered likely the East German statement reflected the Russian viewpoint.

If so, new highway incidents may be unavoidable because American officials have said the Army will not submit to new controls and that convoys with less than 31 passengers will not dismount.

## Newspaper executives eye ruling by Supreme Court

SALEM (UPI) —Newspaper executives today were studying an Oregon Supreme Court ruling to determine what effect it might have on the delivery of daily newspapers.

In a 5-2 split decision Wednesday, the high court upheld a Union County Circuit Court decision which held The Oregonian Publishing Co., and one of its distributors, guilty of negligence in an auto-bus crash.

The distributor did not appeal the verdict, but The Oregonian did, claiming the distributor was an independent contractor, not an employee. The newspaper argued it was not liable for the activities of independent contractors.

The Supreme Court found "that The Oregonian directly exercised considerable control over the detail" of the distributor's operations.

The court said when a firm "makes regular use of the services of individuals over whom it reserves absolute economic control, such persons are subordinates."

**Decision Studied**  
William R. Morrish, assistant to the publisher of The Oregonian, said he had ordered attorneys to study the decision.

"I don't yet know what the full meaning is. I don't know whether this sets a precedent. We'll have to study the decision and await word from our attorneys."

He said he did not know whether it would be possible to appeal the decision in the federal courts, or whether that would be a wise course.

Carl Webb, manager of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association, said the details of the decision would have to be studied.

"The degree of control comes up all the time. It not only applies to newsboys and motor route men, but to newspaper correspondents as well."

"Generally, the firm contracting the work can be interested in performance, but not the way it is achieved. The question revolves around the degree of control. I don't think this decision upsets the little merchant or independent contractor situation, but we will have to study the case."
