

Official warns Calif. can't get Clay-Liston tiff

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — A California boxing official warned Los Angeles promoters Wednesday they may be wasting their time in attempting to obtain the Sonny Liston-Cassius Clay heavyweight fight.

Sol Silverman, chairman of the Governor's Committee for Safeguards in Professional Boxing, pointed out that Liston does not have a license to fight in either California or New York — and that both states "are as one in their opposition to mismatches."

And Liston may have trouble getting a license in California.

Backers of Clay, Liston weighing several offers

DENVER (UPI) — Backers of world heavyweight champion Sonny Liston and challenger Cassius Clay were weighing offers today ranging up to \$1.2 million to stage their title fight next February.

Denver promoter and restaurant owner Milt Willner announced Wednesday he had formed a syndicate to offer \$1.2 million to hold the bout "in Denver or other places." Earlier, three \$1 million offers were made — two from Los Angeles interests and one from Miami. Lesser bids have been made from Chicago, Las Vegas and Minneapolis.

Willner said Sheldon Wolfman, owner of Pal Joe's restaurant in New York, was a principal member of the syndicate. He did not name any others.

"We mean business and are prepared to put a half million dollars on deposit right now," Willner said.

Liston and Clay signed Tuesday for a 15-round fight, to be held tentatively in February. The site and exact date were not determined.

Dufur wins title, Sisters, Culver place 2nd, 3rd

Central Oregon's two Class B 8-man high school football teams finished three and four in Deschutes League standings, a compilation of the league's final win-loss records revealed today.

Sisters High School's Outlaws finished third with a 3-2 win-loss record (they were 4-3 for the entire season) after losing their season finale to Cascade Locks, 27-14. Sisters, half way down the ladder, most of the season had taken over second place the week before by whipping archrival Culver 34-20.

Cascade Locks, however, soundly whipped the locals in the season-end tilt and thus replaced Sisters in the runnerup spot.

Culver's Bulldogs, the other Central Oregon team that had some real ups and downs this season, emerged fourth with a .500 season, winning two, losing two, and tying one. Coach Clarence Namenuk's Bulldogs wound up in fourth place.

Dufur Champs
Dufur, an amazing 8-man aggregation from Wasco County, came on with a "new look" this year complete with new coach and spirit, and waded through five straight league opponents to gain its first league title.

When Dufur whipped Sisters 44-20 October 4, it was the first time in 13 years that the Wasco County boys beat the Outlaws.

Dufur, now adorned with the Deschutes League crown, thus carries the District 2b (8-man) laurels with her to the state playoffs. Dufur, however, will be idle this weekend. The first playoff game for the Dufur-men will be the weekend of November 15-16.

Time, place and Dufur's opponent have not yet been named.

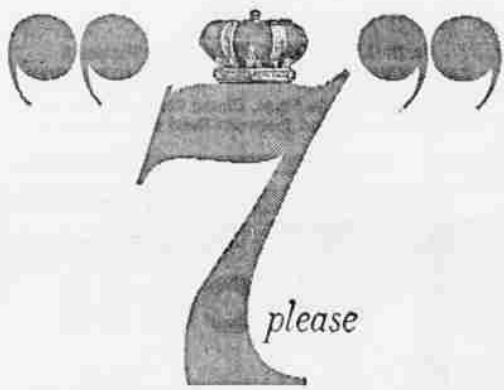
Deutsch equestrians lead
