Frank Ramsey filling in for Celtics' Cousy

The Boston Celtics have found a man to fill Bob Cousy's sparkplug role.
He's veteran Frank Ramsey who Tuesday night broke a close game between the Celtics and the New York Knickerbockers wide open.
The Knicks stayed close to the Celtics through most of the first quarter until Ramsey entered the game and scored nine points in a minute and 49 seconds. Boston then coasted to a 126-98 victory over New York in the second game of a National Basketball Association doubleheader at New York's Madison Square Garden.
In the opener, Oscar Robertson scored 32 points and paced the Cincinnati Royals to a 127-102 win over the Detroit Pistons. In the only other game played the San Francisco Warriors continued their red-hot scoring spree with a 129-96 victory over the St. Louis Hawks.
Bill Russell played only 29 minutes for Boston but grabbed 15 rebounds as the Celtics won their 12th game in 13 starts this season.
Nine Boston players, paced by Sam Jones with 19 points, hit double figures. Len Chappell scored 27 points for New York, followed by Bill McGill with 23.
Cincinnati grabbed the lead from Detroit midway through the first period when Robertson dropped in seven points. Johnny Egan's driving layups drove Detroit to within six points of the lead midway through the third quarter but Cincinnati, led again by Robertson, went on a 23-7 binge that iced the game.
Wilt Chamberlain's 40 points led San Francisco's easiest win of the season. Using a devastating fast break, the Warriors roared off to a 34-10 lead in the first period and St. Louis never could make up the deficit.
The defeat narrowed the Hawks' Western Division margin over Los Angeles to a half-game. Bob Pettit's 24 points were high for the Hawks.

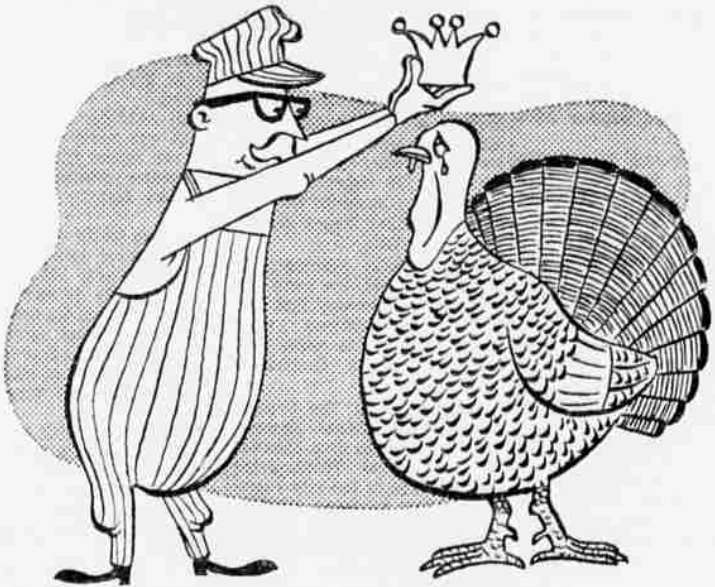
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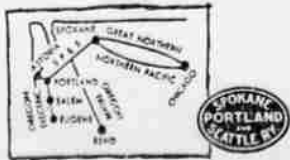
Denver clobbers Totems, running over best goalie

Seattle goalie Claude Dufour may be leading the league in defense, but Denver is not impressed.
A trio of invaders scored twice each Tuesday night as Denver breezed to a 6-1 victory over Seattle. The win kept the latter club from taking over first place in the tense Western Hockey League race.
Dufour had allowed less than three goals per contest going into Tuesday night's game, and had a pair of shutouts.
But John Slevator, Gordie Redahl and Rudy Migay each scored twice and two of the goals occurred 28 seconds apart in the second stanza. It was not Dufour's night.
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Total offense leaders Year of QB's label proving accurate

NEW YORK (UPI) — When experts sagely labeled this the "year of the quarterbacks," they didn't expect it to go this far. The boys under the center leading the country in passing, naturally, and total offense, which figured.
But they're also on top in punting, which is a surprise, have been among the leaders all year in kickoff runbacks, place kicking and scoring, which is a bigger surprise and now, of all things, threaten to take over the country in rushing, too.
Today's NCAA Service Bureau statistics show Gale Sayers leading the rushers and he, predictably, is a halfback. But wait a minute! Right behind Sayers, in good position to overhaul the leader, is Jimmy Sidle of Auburn and he is a T-quarterback. Sayers has a 14-yard lead over Sidle and one game to play (Missouri). Sidle has two games to play (Florida State and Alabama) and is the only one of the rushing leaders who has been averaging more than 100 yards per game.
If Sidle comes through, he will be the first rushing champion in history who wasn't a halfback or fullback. In fact, a quarterback has never so much as contended for the title.
Don Trull, Baylor quarterback, is the leader in passing and total offense, and the punting leader is SMU's Danny Thomas, another quarterback.
Trull's sprint to the top in passing also puts him in sight of a couple of records. His 1860 air yards leaves him 145 short of the major record of 2005 by Nevada's Stan Heath in 1948 and he's only 17 completions short of the all-time record of 159 by Don Klosterman for Los Angeles Loyola in 1951. With two more games, Trull seems certain to knock over both records since he's averaged 232.5 yards and 17.5 completions per outing.
A new challenger soared up to mildly threaten Trull's hold in passing. He's Utah State's Bill Munson, who also holds the distinction of being the only thrower who's fired more than 101 times with fewer than three interceptions. But Munson has only one game to play and the
