Eagles of Bend present Lowell A. Jensen with its civic service award for 1963

Eagles of Bend Sunday afternoon honored Lowell A. Jensen with their civic service award, primarily in recognition of the part the Bend man played in saving the life of Debra Manwiller, 3, from drowning on the late evening of September 21.

The award was a surprise to Jensen, who had been asked to attend a dinner at the FOE Hall, to take part in the presentation of a life membership by the Eagles to the Rev. William Coughlan. Formal presentation of the civic service award to Jensen and the life membership to Father Coughlan were

made by Gordon Monical, chairman of the program. This was the first civic service award made by the Eagles in the past four years. W. M. Loy was the last recipient. On the previous year, Phil F. Brogan was the winner.

A 40-year resident of Bend, Jensen received double recognition at the award dinner — in recognition of his application of mouth-to-mouth resuscitation in saving the life of the little girl, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Don Manwiller, Bend, and for his civic and community work through the years.

Jensen was a leader in the move that resulted in the construction of the million dollar St. Charles Memorial Hospital, opened in 1950. Presently he is a director of the Central Oregon Hospitals Foundation.

The 1963 civic awards plaque winner is a past president of the Deschutes Pioneers' Association, and is a member of the Deschutes County Fair Board. He served on the city planning commission, and is now a member of the city's board of adjustments. Jensen is a long time mem-

ber of the Lions Club, and is a member of the Elks' lodge. He has long been associated with the Eagles.

Dr. C. J. Rice represented the City of Bend at the award dinner, and reviewed the Eagles' many endeavors in the Bend community. He noted leadership provided by the Eagles for Central Oregon College, and said the Eagles' obtained for Bend its first iron lung. 3 in family die in crash

HOOD RIVER (UPI) — Three members of a Portland family were killed early today when their car skidded on rain-slickened U.S. Highway 30 and slid into the path of an oncoming truck.

The victims were the Rev. Ruthie Lee Drake, 52, pastor of the Church of the Living God; her husband, William, 67, and their daughter, Shirley Ann, 14.

A passenger in the car, Patricia Ann Bates, 9, also of Portland, was hospitalized here with a broken collarbone and shock. State Police said Mrs. Drake was driving and apparently became confused when the highway made a slight curve around a construction barrier. She applied the brakes and the car skidded into front of an east-bound Standard Battery, Inc., truck driven by Richard Hearner, 32, Portland. He was uninjured.

Seven persons died in accidents in Oregon during the weekend. There were four traffic fatalities, two shooting deaths and a drowning.

Airman **3C Everett Miller**, 19, Gurnee, Ill., was killed when his car hit a utility pole northeast of Portland in Multnomah County Sunday night.

Norman Rohde, 28, Roseburg, died in a two-car, head-on collision on Interstate 5, three miles north of Myrtle Creek Sunday afternoon.

Mrs. Mary Ward, 63, Talent, was killed when her car struck the back of a truck on Interstate 53, one mile north of Grants Pass Sunday.

John Lansing, 38, Merrill, was struck and killed by a car on State Highway 66, 18 miles west of Klamath Falls Saturday.

Phil Petersen, 17, Eugene, drowned in the Fern Ridge Reservoir when his canoe capsized Saturday. The body of Petersen,

a senior and star athlete at Willamette High School, was not immediately recovered.

Crash blamed on icy highway
PRINEVILLE — An icy spot on highway 26 northwest of Warm Springs caused the hospitalization of Mrs. Casey Bonny, Prineville, Friday morning.

Mrs. Bonny, with Mrs. Mike Thompson, wife of Prineville police chief Thompson, and her daughter LaDeana, were brought to Pioneer Memorial Hospital after the car in which they were traveling struck the icy portion of the pavement and overturned.

The three were driving to Gaston. At the hospital, Mrs. Bonny was found to have suffered a leg injury and LaDeana was treated for a lacerated foot. Mrs. Thompson and her daughter were released from the hospital after examination.

Jack Fine, 40, a member of a prominent Harney County ranching family, accidentally shot and killed himself while seated in his truck near Burns Saturday.

In addition, James Cotton, 20, Coos Bay, was killed when his car was driving collide head-on with a truck on U.S. Highway 99 near Corning, Calif. Saturday. He was a sailor stationed aboard a Navy ship at San Francisco.
