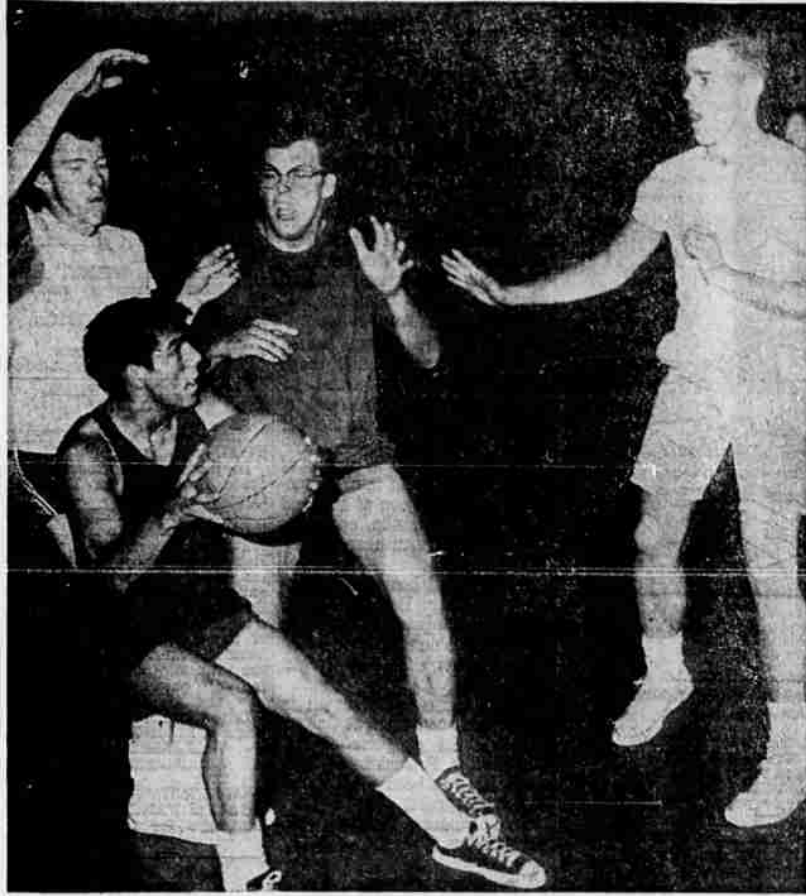


Double billing:
