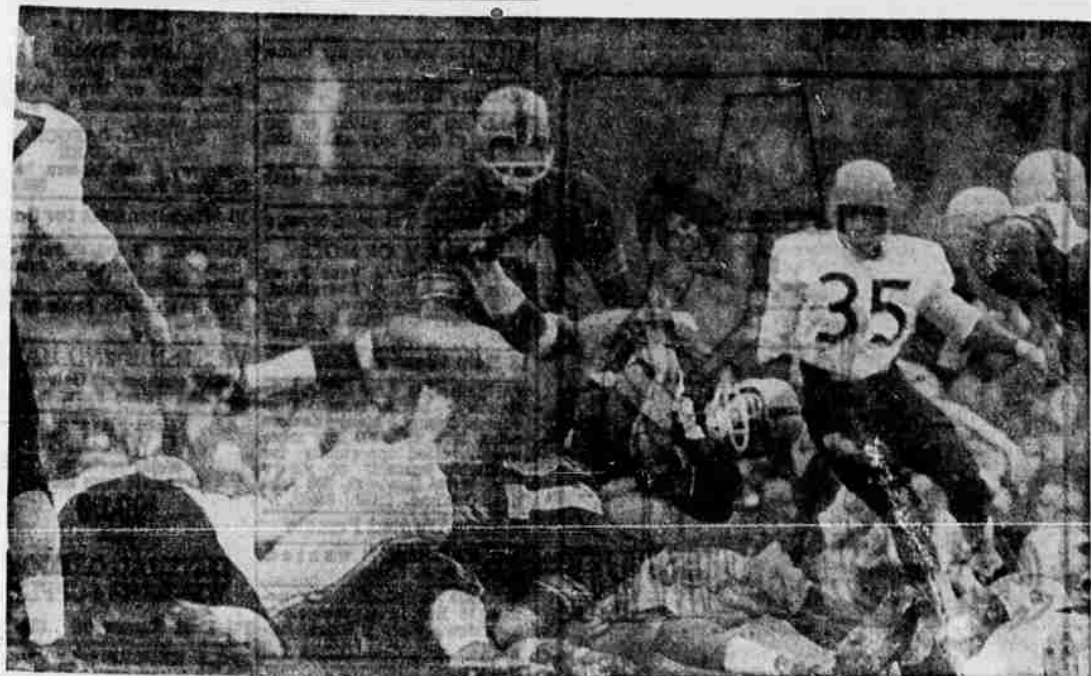

Bend Swim Club, Inc. to raise funds

Bend Swim Club, Inc., an organization comprising the parents of Bend's summer swim team, has emerged short of its winter-fall fund-raising goal.

A December 1 deadline was set for a goal of \$400. Several projects were put on the docket to raise funds. Some of them became realities. Others didn't.

This month, however, will see the group re-convene for another look at the club's financial situation. The original plan behind formulation of the organization was to raise funds so the summer swim team would not have to travel to meets in automobiles.

Last summer the swim team had trouble getting enough parents to drive autos to the sites of competition. Though already having proved unsatisfactory, auto travel produced a fatal accident last summer at mid-season, and claimed the life of Mrs. Joan Hoffman, mother of two swimmers, one of whom is still recuperating in a hospital.

Club Formed
Soon afterwards, the corporation was formed and it was immediately decided the organization should buy a bus for the team to travel in. Difficulties mounted upon difficulties, and after a breakdown of the bus the group was going to buy (the team took it to the Lakeview Invitational) the bus purchase idea was cancelled.

It was then decided the group should acquire a charter service from some established bus line. Facts revealed that it would cost the club less to do it that way, than to buy a bus, keep it maintained, and to afford a competent driver.

Vern Burke gets more A-A honors

NEW YORK (UPI)—National champion Texas and its Southwest Conference rival, Baylor, each placed two players on the 22-man Look magazine All-America team selected by members of the Football Writers Association.

The Texas representatives were halfback Tommy Ford and tackle Scott Appleton, who also was named winner of the Outland Trophy as the year's outstanding interior lineman.

Quarterback Don Trull and his favorite passing target, end-flanker Larry Elkins, were the Baylor nominees.

Trull was one of four quarterbacks named to Look's eight-man backfield. The others were Navy's Roger Staubach, Auburn's Jimmy Sile and Georgia Tech's Billy Lothridge.

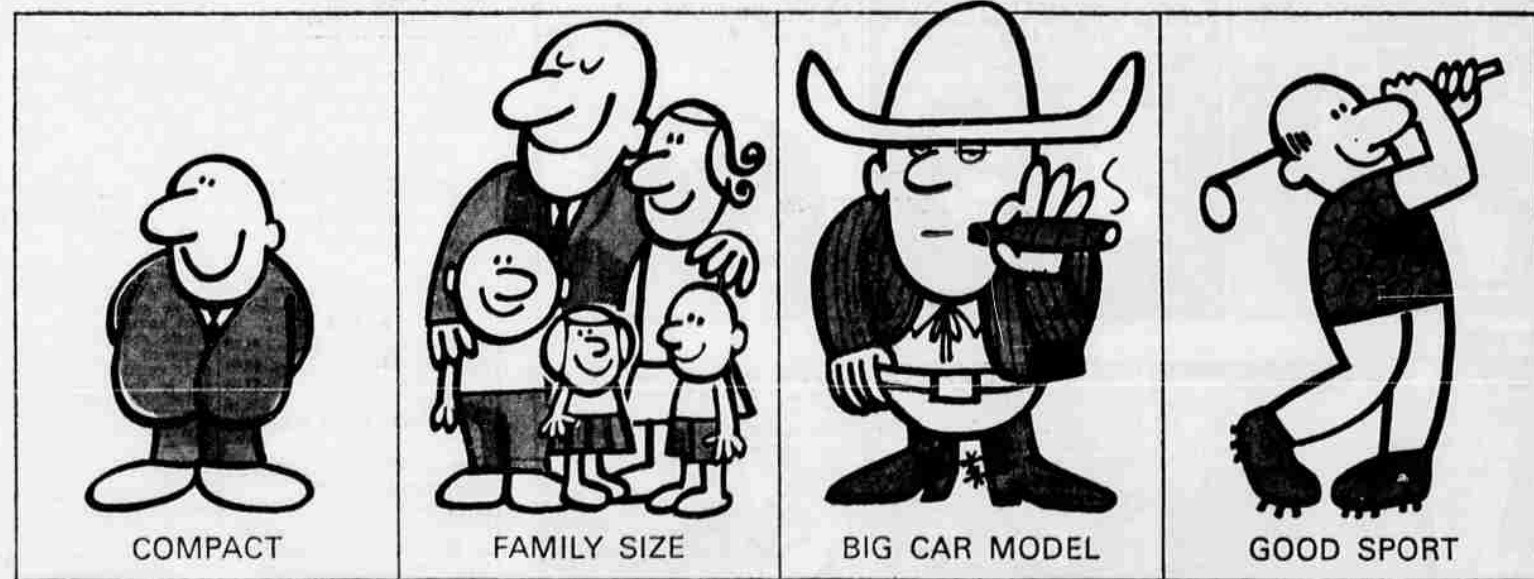
