Casey Stengel coming back for one more shot

SAN DIEGO (UPI) — Casey Stengel's coming back, but this is his last time around. Without spelling it out in big black letters, the chipper 73-year-old Casey made it patently clear today he'll be back with the New York Mets for one more crack even though he's the only unsigned manager in the majors at the moment. "I'm down here working, ain't I, so you can say that I'm going to manage next season," said Stengel, leaving no doubt next year will be his last one in baseball from the tone of his voice. "I feel fine right now," he added, "and I think I got something accomplished that I set out to do. When I took this job, I said I wanted to get a club built; that I was not starting a new career for myself. "Well, I finally got a pitching staff built. I got five men I can sell and if you don't believe me, you can ask anybody in base-

ball." With baseball officials from all 20 major league clubs attending the annual meetings, the colorful Casey still is the prime magnet here. People who frankly confess they don't know beans about baseball wander into the hotel lobby from the streets just to see and listen to Stengel when they learn he's inside. Like all the other managers, Casey spends most of his time trying to make a trade of some sort but admits his hands are tied because, as he puts it, "we can't offer the other clubs guys like Koufax, Mays and Aaron." Nevertheless, he maintains his enthusiasm and is wide awake and still talking long after most of the others are asleep. To strangers one and all he is unfailingly courteous and cooperative whether they ask him to hold still for a photograph or an autograph.

'Jumping Joe' Caldwell soars with Arizona State

By United Press International Jumping Joe Caldwell can turn on a dime and give you nine cents change. Caldwell, a 6-foot-5 high jumper who received honorable mention on last season's UPI All-America college basketball team, tied an Arizona State record of 14 field goals in the Sun Devils' 121-79 victory over Western New Mexico Tuesday night. Caldwell scored 28 points, 18 in the first half. He averaged 19.7 points a game last season as he broke the school scoring record. Minnesota, which hasn't won a Big Ten Conference championship since 1937, has made early competition a proving

ground for the January start of league play. The Gophers won their third straight by defeating Iowa State, 61-50, with the help of sophomore Louis Hudson's 16 points. Clyde Lee, Vanderbilt's 6-foot-9 yearling, netted 25 points as the Commodores breezed past Southern Methodist, 79-60, in an inter-sectional clash. St. Bonaventure, powered by Fred Crawford's 33 points, beat Villa Madonna (Ky.), 94-71, the Bonnies, however, lost the services of center Miles Alken for several games when he re-injured his left knee early in the game. St. John's of New York prepped for a weekend tourney at Morgantown, W. Va., by drubbing George Washington, 82-64.

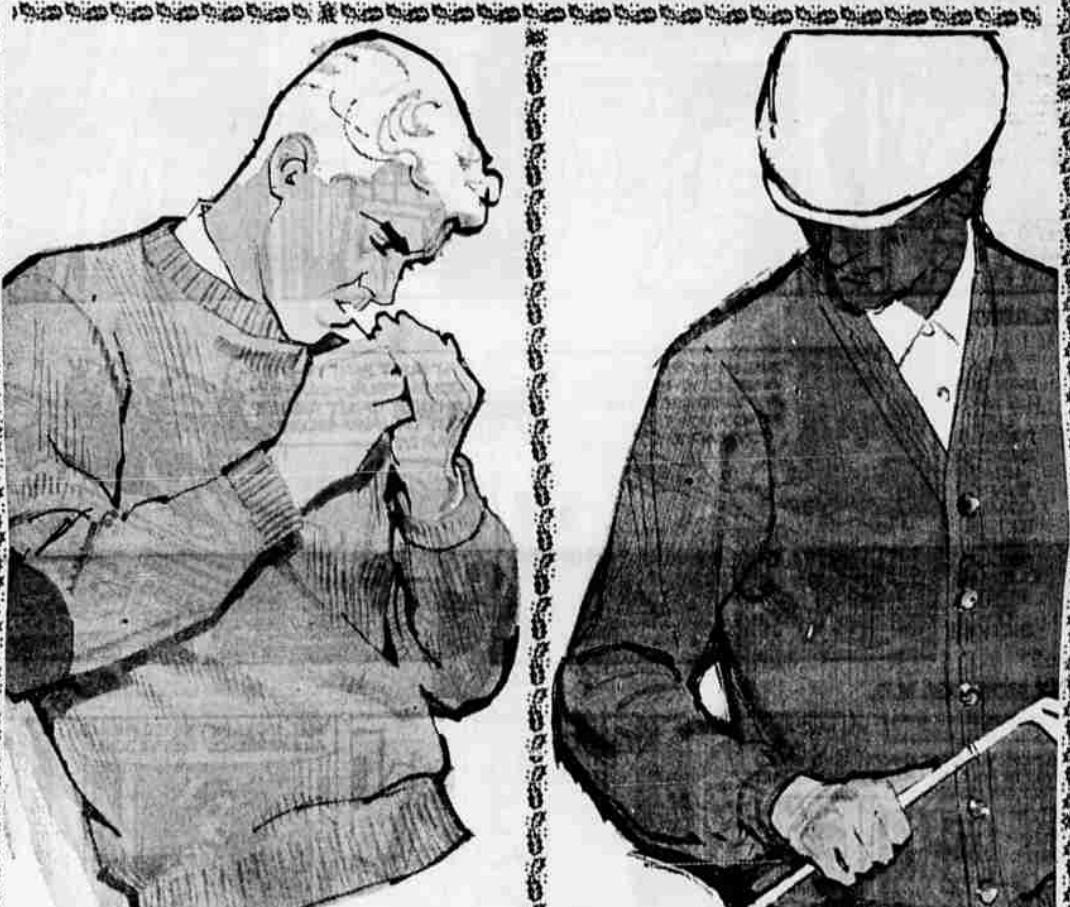
