

# Liston oriented Nilon corporation talking 'big money'

MIAMI (UPI)—The far-flung ramifications of the empire of the Nilon brothers, who more or less control the destinies of heavyweight champion Sonny Liston, took on added scope today.

Husky Bob Nilon, who is listed as executive vice president of Intercontinental Promotions, Inc.—meaning Sonny Liston—as head of Nilon Brothers, Inc., signed a catering contract with Richard E. West, president of Sunshine Park, for the race track near Tampa, Fla.

Liston is president of Intercontinental Promotions, Inc., which has obtained a \$650,000

guarantee from Miami sportsman Bill MacDonald, for a title defense against Cassius Clay of Miami Beach. Intercontinental also will exclusively handle the closed circuit television deal and the insiders are talking an eight to ten million dollar income.

**Tremendous Energy**

But the energy of the Nilons, Bob, Jimmy and Jack, the latter listed as Liston's "advisor," is enough even to bewilder gaseous Cassius.

The Nilons, it must be admitted, have done wonders since four of them came out of service in 1945, pooled \$100 and started a hot dog stand at a construction job. The fourth brother, Joe, who was a Merchant Mariner along with Jim, since has become a Jesuit priest.

"We had agreed to take a crack at the concession business before I went into the Army for five and one-half years and Jack went into the Navy," says Bob, who played hockey at Clarkson Tech, for the U.S. amateur team in the world championships and for Ching Johnson with Minneapolis of the American Association.

"But it seemed like every night was New Year's Eve for Irishmen while we were in service and we all came home broke," he added. "So we put our money together, a sum of \$100, and opened a hot dog stand at a construction job. We grossed \$185 the first day and, well, it's developed."

Developed, it might be added, through hard work. And big. They have catered the Army-Navy game for 14 years and quadrupled the gross on the concessions. They've had a Finger Lakes track near Rochester, N.Y., for two years; cater Baltimore's Civic Center, Utica Memorial Auditorium, college and pro football and numerous industrial plants.

The Dons open a rugged three-game road trip tonight against Okla. St. home State, a team much taller than USF. Games against Loyola of New Orleans and Miami of Florida follow Saturday and Tuesday in a trio of tough tests for the ambitious Dons.

## Hunt reports are varied

PORTLAND (UPI) — The weekly hunting report prepared by the Oregon State Game Commission:

**Northwest:** Duck hunters at the Sauvie Island Game Management area are averaging 1 to 2 birds per trip.

**Central:** Waterfowl hunting along the Columbia below the John Day River has been slow although good flights of geese have been sighted flying out of the John Day area.

**Northeast:** Adverse weather has improved waterfowl hunting on Columbia River, and duck hunting is reported good in Umatilla County. Present snow cover should increase field shooting.

**Southeast:** There are fair numbers of Canada geese in the Goose Lake, Warner Valley, Summer Lake and Harney basin areas. Duck hunting is slow.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The National Rifle Association, a nonprofit membership organization, has announced the establishment of the NRA International type qualification courses.

With the growing interest in International and Olympic shooting in the United States, the NRA now offers a completely new program of international type marksmanship through graded qualification.

Four qualifications: marksman, sharpshooter, expert and distinguished expert, have been established for the nine International Shooting Union courses of fire.

They are: 1) smallbore, three-position; 2) smallbore, prone; 3) 300 meter free rifle; 4) slow fire, free pistol; 5) rapid fire, 22 caliber silhouette; 6) center fire pistol; 7) running deer; 8) international skeet; 9) international clay pigeon.

## Cotton scores TKO over Bale

BELLINGHAM (UPI)—Eddie Cotton of Seattle, No. 1 ranked light heavyweight contender by the World Boxing Association, Wednesday scored a second round technical knockout here over Don Bale of New York.

Referee Terry Cassidy stopped the fight at 2:27 of the round. Bale had taken an automatic eight count after a whistling left uppercut to the jaw.

When the fight was resumed, Cotton unloaded a hard left to the jaw and a solid shot to the body and Cassidy ruled a technical knockout.

Bale weighed 174 while Cotton came in at 177.

Cotton, 36, now has won 49 of 64 fights, including a recent decision over Henry Hank.
