VAL D'ISRERE, France, UPI) —Jean Saubert of Lakeview, Ore., won the ladies giant slalom at the "ninth criterium of the first snow," traditionally the first big international alpine ski meet of the season.

The 21-year-old Oregon State University student streaked over the course in 2 minutes, 1.4 seconds to beat Teresa Obrecht of Switzerland by almost a full second.

The Swiss skier was timed in 2:02.2 with Marielle Gotschel of France third in 2:03.63.

Tenn. State, minus four, still favored

PORTLAND (UPI) —Defending champion Tennessee State, even without four of its varsity players, still is considered the favorite in the Knights of Columbus Invitational Basketball Tournament beginning tonight at Memorial Coliseum.

The Tigers from Nashville play Santa Clara in the tournament opener at 7:30. Host University of Portland takes on Gonzaga's toy Bulldogs in the second contest.

Coach Harold Hunter arrived with only an eight-man Tennessee State squad after guards Bill Bradley and Ron (Icky) Smith, center Bill Smothers and forward Gerald Dudley all were lost earlier this week.

Smith and Smothers were academic victims, Bradley dropped out because of family obligations and Dudley injured a knee. The first three were on the all-tournament team last year.

Gonzaga has a 3-1 mark and is scoring at a 92.5 average despite a starting lineup with 6-2 Jim Harris as the tallest man. Tennessee State (2-1) is hitting at a 97.7 clip.

Santa Clara will take a 1-1 record into the tourney, while Portland is 1-2.

So. Oregon to get changes after athletic dispute...

ASHLAND (UPI) —There will be some changes within a year. Southern Oregon College President Elmo Stevenson said Thursday over a dispute in the school's athletic family.

Dr. Stevenson refused to elaborate.

His comment came after the dispute broke into the open at an Oregon Collegiate Conference meeting in Portland Tuesday. Dr. Alex Petersen, chairman of the physical education department, accused his own school of two violations of OCC compact.

He said the school started basketball practice before the Nov. 1 opening date and charged that athletic scholarships had been issued by coaches instead of an academic committee.

The basketball practice charges were denied by Ted Schopf, SOC athletic director and basketball coach. He said one team meeting was held, and at other times the students just got together to practice without his supervision or coaching.

Stevenson said he first planned to declare his school ineligible for the OCC title this year, but reconsidered and was still studying the situation. The conference has not acted on the matter and no complaints are known to have been made by
