Democrat takes Paget to task

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon Democratic national committeeman Norman A. Stoll has taken his Republican counterpart to task for accusing President Johnson of ignoring a political moratorium called after the Nov. 22 assassination of President Kennedy.

"I was appalled by Lowell Paget's partisan display," Stoll said. He said Paget had "cynically" labeled as political the President's execution of his responsibilities as chief executive of the United States.

"I am astounded that our Republican national committeeman considers economy in government a partisan issue," Paget had charged President Johnson with ignoring the Republican sponsored moratorium by advocating economy measures in government, a stand the Republicans had taken for the last three years, according to the GOP committeeman.

Vicki gets her last look at yule tree

BOWLING GREEN, S.C. (UPI)—Two-year-old Vicki Wray, partially blinded by cancer, joined her eight brothers and sisters today for a last look at the family Christmas tree. Vicki will enter Duke University Medical Center at Durham, N.C., Tuesday where doctors will remove her right eye. Her left eye had been removed last July in an attempt to save the child's life.

"There really won't be any Christmas in this house," said her father, Robert Wray, a \$50-a-week mill hand who works in nearby Clover. "I've told the big children not to expect anything. I don't know how to tell the little ones."

Wray, 39, said Vicki's Christmas wish was a tree, decorated with colored bulbs and shining ornaments. Lacking enough money to purchase one, he went to some nearby woods and cut down a tree.

"We had some ornaments left over from last year and used those," he said. "But there will be no presents."

Warning given on B-B guns

In a statement directed at parents Police Chief Emil Moen reminds that juvenile court action will follow any arrest made against youngsters shooting B-B guns inside city limits.

Moen's statement is prompted by a flood of complaints received in recent weeks of windows and other property damaged by B-B gun pellets. A city ordinance also prohibits the shooting of sling-shots, bow and arrow or similar weapons. Moen adds that parents can be held responsible for children caught shooting these devices.

Soldier defects to Communists

SEOUL, Korea (UPI)—U.S. Army SP-4 Jerry Wayne Parrish had a good service record before his alleged defection to Communist North Korea, a United Nations Command (UNC) spokesman said today.

Parrish, 19, of Henderson, Ky., had no access to classified information, he added.

Communist North Korea's Radio Pyongyang said Sunday that Parrish defected Dec. 6. The UNC confirmed that he had disappeared while on patrol on that date.

In accordance with the usual regulations, Parrish was simply listed as absent without leave. If he does not show up within 30 days, he will be listed as a deserter.

The UNC said that Parrish had the tail position in a six-man patrol among the demarcation line between North and South Korea on the day he disappeared.

When the other members of the patrol noticed he was missing they turned back and found his M-14 carbine, cartridge belt and an unsigned hand-printed note.

It said, "Tell my mother I love her. I will be back some day. Tell my friends goodbye." Parrish would be the third defector since the Korean War ended 10 years ago.

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Senate today confirmed the nomination of Eugene Hulet to be U.S. marshal for Oregon.

The confirmation was unanimous. Hulet, a Democratic state representative, was picked to succeed the late Paul Kearney.

Four arrested following spree

BUCKHOLTS, Tex. (UPI)—A posse today captured four tired, grubby carnival workers, sought for what police said was a three-state crime spree which included the brutal slaying of an Alabama man.

The men were arrested in an abandoned house a mile south of this small central Texas town.

Capt. Clint Peoples of the Texas Rangers said some of the more than 75 law enforcement officers searching for the men reported they saw "suspicious movements" in the house.

The house was surrounded, and the men were ordered to come out. Peoples said the men "didn't put up too much of a struggle." He said they were armed, but that no shots were fired during the capture.
