# Randy Snider takes firsts in Gillis go

**BACHELOR BUTTE** — It was a great weekend for teenage Skyliner skier Randy Snider. Taking advantage of hard-packed snow and good surface ski conditions, Snider took the Jeri Gillis Memorial Novice Ski Races by a veritable mountain storm.

Snider, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lester Snider, 364 E. Greenwood Avenue, captured both the downhill and the slalom events for boys. His double win, coupled with countless other Skyliners who soared home ahead of other competitors, gave the Bend ski aggregation a grand weekend on the slopes of Bachelor Butte.

Snider took Saturday's slalom course in 1:08.7, two seconds ahead of second place winner Frank Morris, also a Skyliner. Sunday, he captured the downhill with a time of 1:07.7, beating runnerup James Simonson of the Yakima Valley Ski Club by about the same margin.

Generally speaking, the Skyliners took the boys' events hands down. The races, however, are run for individuals. There is no team effort. No team trophies are given.

In the girls' events, however, it was Betty Luger of the Yakima Valley Ski Club that did them all in. She, like Randy Snider, captured both events.

Miss Luger sailed home to win Sunday's downhill with a time of 1:17.3. She won the slalom course in 1:13.8.

Yakima Valley skiers and the Skyliners did most of the placing. Several skiers went unattached. Skiers from other clubs, South Eugene Ski Team and the Oswego Ski Club, also competed. Cascade of Portland also had representatives as did a defunct Santiam Club.

## Pilots win KC casaba tourney

**PORTLAND (UPI)** — Cincy Powell scored 26 points and Steve Anstett added 21 as the Portland Pilots turned back defending champion Tennessee State 75-69 in the finals of the fifth annual Knights of Columbus invitational basketball tournament Saturday night.

The Portlanders overcame a 39-35 halftime deficit to win. Gonzaga's Bulldogs, with Elmer Deschaine getting 29 points and Bill Suter collecting 24, defeated Santa Clara 87-74 to take third place in the two-night four-team tourney.

The decisions left Portland with a 3-2 record, Tennessee State with a 4-2 mark, Gonzaga with a 4-2 record and Santa Clara with a 1-3 mark for the season.

## Griffith makes big bid

### Welterweight champ seeks go as midweight challenger

**NEW YORK (UPI)** — Welterweight champion Emile Griffith makes an all-out bid for challenger's role in the lively midweight division Friday night at Pittsburgh against top midweight contender Ruben (Hurricane) Carter.

Griffith of New York, fighter of the year and the only man to win the 147-pound crown three times, already has beaten 160-pound contenders Holy Mims and Jose Gonzalez in 1963.

And now Emile is favored at 9-5 over slugger Carter of Paterson, N.J.

If Griffith, 24, lives up to the odds by harnessing the "Hurricane" he would be an extremely attractive challenger at the box office, in a "battle of champions" for Joey Giardello's new 160-pound crown.

Giardello of Cherry Hill, N.J., took the title from Nigerian Dick Tiger at Atlantic City, Dec. 7. Now Joey admits he has a "gentlemen's agreement" for a return title fight with Tiger. However, the World Boxing Association (WBA) banned return-bout contracts or agreements some time ago.

Carter, 26, already is in challenging position and he plans to file "official" challenges with the WBA and New York State Commission if he beats Griffith.

Archie Litman is promoting Friday's nationally televised 10-round at Pittsburgh's Civic Arena. New York's Madison Square Garden Boxing Corporation is serving as television producer.

Meanwhile slugger Florentino Fernandez of Cuba and Miami Beach earned another middleweight contenders' fight at the Garden "some time in February" by turning the tables in bloody fashion on Argentina's Juan (Rocky) Rivero at the Garden last Friday night.

Left-hooker Fernandez, who is ranked seventh by the WBA, stopped Rivero at the end of the seventh round in their scheduled 10-round return fight.

Art Johnson, publicity director for the Forty Niners, said the signing took place in Miami Sunday.
