Church to be used first time Christmas day

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Pre-induction call biggest here since Korean war

The Tri-County U.S. Selective Service Board, with headquarters in Bend, has received a call for 81 registrants to be examined in January.

This is the largest pre-induction call received by the Mid-state Board since the Korean war.

Of the 81 total sought, 65 are to be sent to Portland on January 22 for pre-induction physicals, with 16 ordered for January 27. However, the Selective Service office has not yet received a January induction call.

At present, the Board has only seven in its acceptable pool. All seven have passed their pre-induction physicals.

Today, 15 men were sent to Portland for physicals.

"The state has substantially failed to meet the induction

calls for November and December, 1963," state selective service officers said.

Statistics for November reveal part of the story of the state's failure to meet calls, it was noted.

There were 789 state calls for physical examination. A total of 1092 were ordered by the local board to appear. Of this total, 299 cancellations were made, and a total of 122 failed to report.

The Armed Forces examination station in Portland disqualified 237. There are 143 administratively undetermined, and 92 were transferred from the state. That left only 199 qualified.

"January calls must be filled," State Selective Service officers said.

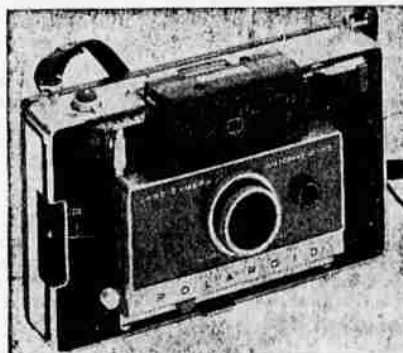

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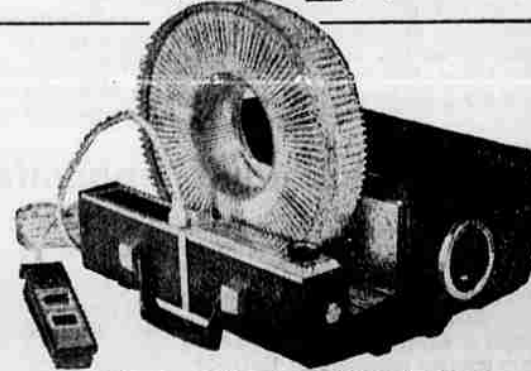
