## Thornton says he won't be court candidate

**SALEM (UPI)** — Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton said today he would not seek election to the Oregon Supreme Court next year, and would announce whether he would seek re-election "after the first of the year."

Thornton, a Democrat, quickly added "I like my job. It's the best lawyer's job in the state, and the most interesting."

Asked if that meant he intended to try for a fourth term, Thornton replied, "I'll make my announcement after the first of the year."

Thornton, 53, was first elected attorney general in 1952. He will have completed 12 years in office at the end of 1964.

Thornton was an unsuccessful candidate for governor in 1960.

### Finances A Factor

Asked if he might be a democratic candidate for governor when Gov. Mark Hatfield's present term expires, Thornton replied "I'd have to think about that. I'm not sure I'd like to enter the governor's race again unless I had sufficient financial backing."

The attorney general insisted he would not seek election to the State Supreme Court, he terms of Justices George Rossman, Gordon Sloan and Kenneth J. O'Connell expire at the end of 1964. Justice Rissman, 78, is over retirement age, and cannot seek re-election.

There had been speculation in some quarters that Thornton might seek election to the high court.

In discussing the role of attorney general, Thornton said, "It would be a great mistake to make the office an appointive position," as some have suggested.

He added, "It is a good safeguard to have the office independent. You wouldn't get the same check and balance system if the attorney general were appointed."
