Proposal made on sales tax

PORTLAND (UPI) — A constitutional amendment to enable Oregon to establish a sales tax was proposed last week by Norman L. Easley, of Portland, chairman of the Income and Property Tax Relief Committee. The proposed amendment would authorize a sales tax of up to 4 per cent and provides that between 60 and 75 per cent of the revenue would be used to reduce income and property taxes.

The tax would exclude food sold in grocery stores or markets and drugs. Tied to the sales tax plan is a restriction that present income tax rates cannot be increased nor deductions or exemptions altered unless such changes would result in a saving to the taxpayer.

Easley said he was recommending a constitutional amendment to avoid any possibility of the sales tax being ruled unconstitutional. He said he had spent two months discussing tax problems with groups around the state and doing research.

3 counties put under single welfare head

SALEM (UPI)—Welfare operations in Wasco, Sherman and Hood River counties were consolidated last week under a single Administrator, William Todd, the Public Welfare Commission announced.

Todd, who had headed the Hood River County Welfare Department, assumed additional responsibility for the other two departments, replacing Miss Dorothy Eakin, who retired.

Welfare Administrator Andrew F. Juras said the consolidation is expected to bring increased efficiency and reduced costs.

The three county welfare commissions will retain their individual identity so that policy decisions continue to be made on the local level. Offices will remain open to serve the public in both The Dalles and Hood River, and Todd will divide his time as needed among the three counties.

Juras said an earlier triple combination, set up last June in Morrow, Gilliam and Wheeler counties under administrator Lowell Challey produced even greater financial savings than originally anticipated.
