# Woman named state chairman by Democrats

PORTLAND (UPI) — Mrs. Martha Ann Adelsheim of Portland was chosen as chairman of the Oregon Democratic party Sunday.

She is the organization's first woman state chairman. Mrs. Adelsheim was elected by members of the State Central Committee on the third ballot by a vote of 26 to 24 over Francis Reagan, a Portland attorney.

The voting opened with three candidates on the ballot. Mrs. Adelsheim received 25 votes, Reagan had 23 and Carrel Payton of Coquille was given 2 on the first ballot.

On the second ballot, Mrs. Adelsheim and Reagan each received 25 votes. Payton withdrew.

Mrs. Adelsheim succeeds E. D. Spencer, who resigned to become postmaster of Salem.

Norman Stoll, Democratic national committeeman for Oregon, told Central Committee members the state will be entitled to 24 delegates at the national convention. He recently returned from a meeting of the national committee at Washington, D.C.

# Mrs. Stout crowned queen of Deschutes Pioneer group

Reigning over the 729-member Deschutes Pioneers' Association in 1964 as queen is an old-timer of Central Oregon who has memories of several frontiers—the Tahoe Lake country of Nevada, the frigid lands of Alaska and Oregon's Lake County in the homesteading days.

She is Florence Stout, resident of Bend for many years.

Mrs. Stout received the Pioneers' queen crown Saturday night at the annual reunion, dinner and program of the old timers at the Masonic Hall. Her identity remained secret until the coronation hour.

Wearing a pale - blue satin dress, Mrs. Stout was escorted into the hall by a past president, Dr. R. D. Ketchum. Crown and flower bearers, who preceded the queen and escort, were Bruce and Mark Reynolds, sons of Bend's Mayor Paul Reynolds and Mrs. Reynolds.

The crown, with its glittering jewels, taken from a bank vault for the occasion, was placed on Mrs. Stout's head by the Fossen.

The new queen is a native of Cohoes, New York, where she was born in 1885, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ambrose Vaine. The family moved to the Carson River country of Nevada, to a stock ranch, late in the past century, then headed for the Alaskan gold fields in 1898. In Skagway, Florence Vaine in

1905 was married to E. Finch Pitman's new president, Antone Pitman, a United States customs official. Their son, Phillip, was born in Skagway. The family also lived for a time in Seward, then returned to Skagway. In Skagway, the family by chance in 1910 received some literature from the old Bend Commercial Club, which described homesteads awaiting land seekers on the new Oregon frontier. Soon the family was in the Deschutes country, and Mr. and Mrs. Pitman leased the old Rosland Hotel — then moved to the hotel to a new townsite, LaPine. That hotel was the nucleus of the new town. The family stayed in LaPine three and a half years, then Pitman filed on a desert claim in the Paisley area. There Mrs. Pitman operated the Chewaucan Hotel.

# Morse believes canal has lost military value

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., contended Sunday that the Panama Canal has lost its military value and should be replaced by another controlled by all the nations of the hemisphere.

Morse also blamed "colonialistic" U.S. policies for sparking the current crisis and recommended that Americans working in the Canal Zone be limited to a two-year tour of duty there.

In a recorded interview (Radio Press International—From The People), he noted that a great deal of modern shipping is unable to use the Panama Canal.

"There's very little security importance to the Panama Canal left," Morse commented. "We can't get our great defense ships through the canal and so we maintain two defense fleets, one in the Pacific and one in the Atlantic. And one of the reasons we do it is because the Panama Canal as a defense weapon is obsolete and of course in modern times we know that defense problems depend a great deal on our strength in the air and of course the Panama Canal is a sitting duck. One bomb will knock it out."

The senator advocated construction of a sea level canal at an unspecified site. He suggested that excavation for such a waterway could be accomplished through the use of an atomic blast.

Morse suggested that it be built as "a hemispheric canal, as an Alliance for Progress Canal, as an Organization of American States Canal." The financing, he said, could be undertaken by loans from the OAS member nations, including the United States.

Raper told police officers he lost control of his southbound vehicle when he applied his brakes, after seeing the brake-lights of the vehicle preceding him. Slush - coated pavement caused the car to veer.

The ranch was sold for a reported \$500,000 to Robert B. Wilson, president of Warm Springs Lumber Co. The former owner was Jim Pogue, of Rocky Hill Inc., Exeter, Calif.

"We are convinced the purchaser... and the seller... were aware that Short held a position of director of agriculture (and) that the position held by Short did not influence either Wilson or Pogue in dealing through Short," the Board said.
