Foreign ministers seek solution to thorny dispute over Malaysia

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI)—The foreign ministers of Malaysia, Indonesia, and the Philippines met today to seek a peaceful solution to the dispute over Malaysia before it grows into a war in Southeast Asia that could involve the United States.
 Thailand's Foreign Minister Thanat Khoman told the three nations there should be no "confrontation at the conference table," an apparent reference to Indonesia's militant opposition to the British-backed Malaysian federation.
 Indonesian Foreign Minister Subandrio said the confrontation policy would end if the talks here are successful.
 The talks, which have no scheduled termination date, are the first step in the plan of Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy to move the Malaysia crisis "from the jungles to the conference table."
 Kennedy arranged for the foreign ministers to meet and for a subsequent summit meeting of the three nations to be held.
 During his meetings with the leaders of the three nations last month, Kennedy got Indonesia

U.S. airlifting Americans from Cyprus

NICOSIA, Cyprus (UPI)—The United States began airlifting American women and children from strife-torn Cyprus today, and an embassy spokesman hinted at armed intervention if danger threatens any of those who remain behind.
 Two chartered Pan American jetliners took 134 Americans from Nicosia to Beirut, Lebanon, this morning.
 At least four more chartered planes stood by to carry others of the 800 American dependents from this embattled Mediterranean Island where nascent civil warfare and growing anti-American feeling brought bombing attacks on the U.S. Embassy Tuesday.
 A U.S. Embassy spokesman said he did not know how many American dependents would remain on Cyprus at the end of the airlift.
 "But in case of danger," he said, "we will ask Cyprus police to protect them and, if necessary, will call upon our Marines."
 The nearest force of U.S. Marines is believed to be aboard ships of the Sixth Fleet operating in the eastern Mediterranean.
 Automatic recognition but unlike Indonesia has taken no hostile action against Malaysia.
 France, meanwhile, opened a further breach in Western unity by announcing it would not take part in any peace-keeping operation on Cyprus as proposed by the United States and Britain.
 The airlift was authorized Tuesday night by U. S. Ambassador Fraser Wilkins after two bombings at the U. S. Embassy here capped more than a month of inter-communal conflict and mounting anti-American feeling.
 Two private cars owned by Americans were set on fire Tuesday night in different parts of the capital.
 The incidents apparently were in protest against an Anglo-American proposal to station a NATO peace force in Cyprus.
 Diplomats in London began negotiations on the Cyprus government's demand that any NATO force sent to Cyprus be under the authority of the United Nations. The force would keep peace between the warring Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities pending political accord.
