Reminder given

Disabled war veterans and war widows must apply for their annual state property tax exemptions by April 1, 1964, H. A. Starr, Deschutes County veterans service officer, cautioned today.

Application for the exemption, which amounts to \$7500 of the true cash value of the property, is filed with the county assessor.

Those entitled include: war veterans 40 per cent or more disabled; unmarried widows of war veterans; and Spanish-American war veterans, regardless of disability.

Disabled veterans and widows living in house trailers may receive an annual license fee reduction of up to \$100 by filing with the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Assistance on the benefits is available from the county service officer at the Deschutes County Courthouse in Bend.

Day of Prayer to be observed here Feb. 14

The 78th annual World Day of Prayer will be observed in Bend Friday, February 14, at 1:30 p.m. at Trinity Episcopal Church. The local council of United Church Women is the sponsoring group. Everyone interested is invited to attend.

The local women will be joining in a world-wide prayer fellowship with hundreds of thousands of women throughout the world, in 150 areas on six continents. Observances in various parts of the world will create a 24-hour vigil.

Theme for this year is "Let Us Pray." The service was prepared by Dr. Madeline Barot, executive secretary of the Department on the Cooperation of Men and Women in Church, Family and Society of the World Council of Churches, Geneva, Switzerland.

Mrs. Eugene White of Trinity Episcopal Church will present the meditation at the local service. Others taking part will be Mrs. Gordon Akeson, Episcopal; Mrs. Robert Newland, First Christian; Mrs. Roy Saylor, First Presbyterian; and Mrs. Paul Taylor, First Methodist.

A free-will offering to be taken as part of the observance will help in the furtherance of five special projects, including Christian colleges for women in Asia and Africa.

The funds will also make possible the translation, printing and distribution of Christian literature in many parts of the world, assist the present programs among Indian-Americans and the support of migrant ministry, assist in extending hospitality to foreign students visiting American families, and strengthening Christian work overseas.

A special gift to be used in the United States will make possible the continuation of a new program of ministry among newcomers in communities.

A baby sitter will be provided for the service in Bend.

Roth to fight ouster move

PORTLAND (UPI)—Phillip J. Roth, State Republican chairman, said Thursday he is prepared to fight any attempt to oust him from the post at a meeting here Saturday.

Roth said he would not resign. Jim Allison, of Scholls, Washington County alternate chairman, said one of the changes in bylaws he has offered would end the terms of all state officers at the end of February or early in March.

Allison said he offered the by-laws change with no intention of ousting anyone. He said it was his hope that officers would be elected with the understanding that they will be re-elected in the statutory summer reorganization of the committee.

James Rock, Corvallis, Benton County chairman, indicated there was a movement afoot to oust Roth, but said he has nothing to do with the proposed by-laws change.

The ouster effort was expected to work through the proposed change in the bylaws, however. Roth was elected chairman in March, 1 over Gene Browne of Grants Pass.
