## 'No possibility of my losing,' Liston offers

MIAMI BEACH (UPI) — Heavyweight champion Sonny Liston had so little regard for challenger Cassius Clay today as they rested for Tuesday night's title fight that he not only predicted a three-round kayo over Cassius but added: "There is no possibility of my losing."

That's a rare statement, indeed, for any fighter to make—perhaps an unprecedented one—before an encounter in which a head-butt, an elbow slash, or an ankle turn might cause a technical knockout defeat.

Liston, 30, apparently has less respect for unbeaten Clay, 23, than even the sports writers have for gaseous Cassius. Three writers picked the "Louisville Lip" to wrest the crown from Liston—among 45 polled. And one of the three forecast Clay's 20th straight professional victory on a knockout within 13 rounds.

Although Clay is doing only roadwork in the mornings and making no public appearances now, he still says he'll knock out Liston in the eighth round.

Fans of the Miami area certainly do not share Clay's confidence. They are avoiding the box-office windows in regiments. And millionaire Bill McDonald, backer of the "live" fight at the Miami Beach Convention Hall, admits he'll probably take a financial bath to the tune of about \$300,000.

MacDonald, a retired auto-trailer manufacturer, paid \$525,000 to Intercontinental Promotions, Inc., for the live show. He must draw about \$850,000 to cover the purchase price and his expenses.

However, Nathan L. Helpert reported today that the "momentum is picking up" at the 271 locations for closed-circuit television in the United States and Canada and there still is a chance that nearly all of the 1,103,451 seats in those locations will be sold—a long chance.

A sellout would provide closed-circuit receipts of about \$5,100,000, Helpert said. Helpert is president of Theatre Network Television, Inc. (TNT).

## 'Bullet' Bob Hayes nips 60-yard dash track mark

NEW YORK (UPI) —Bullet Bob Hayes can receive double billing as the world's "fastest human" on any track show these days.

Hayes, a barrel-chested speed demon who last year set a world record of 9.1 seconds for the 100-yard dash, became the first man to crack the six-second barrier in the 60-yard distance Saturday when he was clocked in 5.9 seconds at the National AAU track and field games at Madison Square Garden.

The fleet-footed Florida A&M star knew he had it made from the start and he achieved the milestone to record the first of two world shattering individual marks in the AAU meet.

Ron Clarke, a suntanned Australian, bettered the three-mile standard in 13 minutes, 18.4 seconds.

Both complimented the opposition on pushing them to history-making performances.

North Carolina College recorded the third world record of the night by winning the sprint medley in 1:51.3. The old mark of 1:52 was set in 1953 by a New York Grand Street boys quartet that included Olympic champions Mal Whitfield, Andy Stanfield, Herb McKenley and George Rhoden.

Two other meet records were set and another tied.

Gary Gubner, the New York University strong man, eclipsed his AAU indoor record in the shot put on his final toss by heaving the weight 63 feet, 2½ inches. He holds the world indoor mark of 64-11½.

Maryland State established a new mule relay mark of 3:16.2 to better the old standard of 3:16.3 held by Morgan State.

Hayes Jones of Detroit won his 53rd consecutive indoor victory and tied his own meet record of 7.0 seconds in the 60-yard high hurdles.

A pair of servicemen won their specialties. Lt. Charles Buchta of the Quantico Marines taking the 600-yard run in 1:21.1 and Lt. Ernie Cunniffe of the U.S. Air Force finishing first in the 1,000-yard run with a time of 2:14.8. Ergas Lepis of the Toronto Track Club was clocked in a slow 4:09.6 as he won the mile run.

In field events, John Thomas of the Boston Athletic Club won the high jump with a leap of seven feet, one inch; Charlie Mays of the Grand Street Boys broad-jumped 26 feet, 1½ inches to defeat Ralph Boston; John Uelses of LaSalle won the pole vault on fewer misses as he tied the meet record of 15 feet, 6 inches, and Al Hall of the New York Athletic Club tossed the 35-pound weight in the hammer throw 65 feet, 8 inches.

## Finley signs stadium lease

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI) — Charles O. Finley, embattled owner of the Kansas City Athletics, jumped from the clutches of the American League back into the collective lap of the city council today.

The unpredictable owner pulled the unexpected again Sunday night by accepting the city's demand for a four-year lease on Municipal Stadium, a lease he repeatedly had vowed never to sign.

But the city was in no hurry to put its signature on the dotted line. Finley, who has threatened to sue the American League, made it clear he was accepting the lease in the face of a league threat to kick him out of baseball.

Mayor Ilus W. Davis, to whom Finley addressed his telegram of acquiescence, said he was happy that the owner had accepted the city's proposal.

But the mayor and other city officials declined further comment until after a meeting today of the city council's baseball committee. Davis said he also would confer with Joseph Cronin, president of the American League, to determine the league's reaction to Finley's latest move. Cronin received a copy of Finley's telegram.

The baseball committee meeting was scheduled to begin at 11 a.m., EST.
