

Sisters Outlaws, Culver Bulldogs take setbacks at district

THE DALLES — Sisters High School's Outlaws and the Culver Bulldogs took opening day setbacks here yesterday, and were eliminated from the District 6 B Tournament.

Wheeler County (Fossil) belted Sisters, 69-44, and Cascade Locks brought Culver up short, 72-60.

Rick Jacobsen had a good afternoon for the Sisters five, canning 13 tallies. He was followed by teammate Dennis Barclay with 8.

Sisters' Outlaw hand was anything but impressive. Offensive efforts seem to sputter almost before they were organized. Sisters had defensive troubles, and Wheeler dominated the boards throughout.

Sisters Had Moments
Sisters had some good moments, though they were short lived. The Outlaws of Coach Roy Runco started moving about halfway through the second quarter, but found the margin too great.

Sisters trailed at halftime after being down 15-1 at one point in the first quarter. Wheeler's first quarter spurge and defensive vise killed Sisters before the locals could get started.

Dave Ostrander paced the Fossil five and garnered high point honors with a contribution of 22 counters. He was followed by teammate Ned Nickelsen with 19. Ken Wham got 11.

Late in the third period Sisters came alive and closed the gap to 42-35. The Outlaws then went stone cold as the Fossil Falcons pulled steadily away.

Urback Impressive
Sisters kicked off the tournament with Wheeler, and Culver wound up the day's play against Cascade Locks.

Rick Urback and Don Steinbeck impressed Columbia River area fans with some "beautiful" displays of shooting, but it wasn't enough to pass the 'Locks crew.

Cascade Locks did them in (for the third straight time this year), by a tally of 72-60. Urback canned 20 and came away with high point honors. Steinbeck tallied 9. The 'Locks crew was paced by James Holman with 16, Paul Holladay with 15, and Jesse Stewart with 13.

Unlike the Sisters - Wheeler tilt, Culver go-around with Cascade Locks was nip and tuck, especially in the first half.

Culver did well in the opening and closing stanzas, outscoring the 'Locks in both frames. The

Bulldogs, however, went through some long dry spells in the second and third quarters. Cascade Locks was much more consistent in its performance.

Culver — .300
Culver hit about .300 from the field, and Cascade Locks hit near a .350 clip. From the gift toss line, Culver converted 14 of 26 foul shots, and Cascade Locks 20 of 34.

Culver, charged with 23 fouls, saw ace Steinbeck foul out with 3:53 remaining in the game.

In other games yesterday, Maupin slaughtered Arlington, 68-29, and Coudon got by scrap-

py Dufur, 54-40.
Tonight at 7, Wheeler faces Maupin, and at 8:30, Coudon plays Cascade Locks. Winners Friday play the championship game Saturday at 8:30 p.m. Losers Friday play a consolation game Saturday at 7 p.m. One team only (the tourney winner) will go to the state tournament at Pendleton next weekend.
