A farewell to Gill, his teams were good

Now that the Sportslooker has buried Oregon State's retiring basketball coach, perhaps it is time to offer some of his outstanding accomplishments.

Amory T. (Slat) Gill is one of the most respected coaches in the country. He has been for many years. All of his coaching has been at Oregon State, his own Alma Mater.

He was an All-American at OAC himself in 1924. After coaching the frosh team, Gill took over as head mentor at the start of the 1926-1929 season. From that day on, Oregon State has been a national hoop power.

There have been some lean years, but there have been some very good ones. Gill's squads have nailed down 12 championships of different kinds. This is excluding his eight consecutive Far West Classic titles, and winning the Chancellor's Trophy 11 of its 12 years running.

OSC's Beavers won northern division championships in 1933, 1935, 1940, 1942, 1947, 1949, 1955, and tied for it in 1958. The 1949 aggregation placed fourth in the nation and the Beavers ranked fifth in 1955, 1957 and 1962.

1963 — A Top Year

Gill's 1963 club must rank as one of his best. Oregon State captured the NCAA Western Regionals and finished fourth in the nation with a 22-9 win-loss mark. This year's team, though it didn't go as far in the playoffs, came off with even a better record, 25 wins and four losses.

One coveted goal, however, has eluded Slat Gill in all his years at Oregon State. He has never brought home a national title to Corvallis.

Several times the Beavers were close. Perhaps the closest was in 1947. Lew Beck, Cliff Crandall, Morrie Silver, Red Rocha and company were nosed by two points by Oklahoma at

Seattle, now 21-5 stunned this Oregon State University city Tuesday night by upsetting the 5th ranked Beavers, 61-57, at Eugene.

UCLA, the team that had everything during the regular season, opens its bid tonight for the NCAA major college basketball title.

The Uclans carry a perfect 26-0 mark into the Far West regionals, were named the No. 1 team in the nation by UPI's board of coaches and John Wooden was honored as coach of the year.

UCLA plays upstart Seattle in the nightcap of a doubleheader at Corvallis, Ore. Utah State meets San Francisco in the opening game.

Defending champion Loyola of Chicago goes against Michigan and Kentucky plays Ohio University in the Midwest regionals at Minneapolis, Minn.

In the East regionals at Raleigh, N.C., Duke takes on Villanova and Princeton meets Connecticut, while Wichita tangles with Creighton and Texas Western is pitted against Kansas State at Wichita, Kan., in the Midwest regionals.

NIT Opens

The National Invitation Tournament opened in New York Thursday night with St. Joseph's (Pa.) defeating Miami (Fla.), 86-76, and New York University stopping Syracuse, 77-68.

St. Joseph's beat the nation's No. 1 scoring team as Steve Courtin tallied 30 points for the Hawks and Billy Oakes netted 21. Rick Barry, fifth leading scorer in the country, led Miami with 35 points.
