

Prineville kids to hold fish derby

PRINEVILLE — Swarms of youngsters bristling with fishing poles will gather on the shores of Barnes Butte pond for six hours on May 23 for the annual junior fish derby, co-sponsored by the Recreation Unlimited division, Hudspeth Industries, and the Central Oregonian.

Any boy or girl aged 16 or younger is eligible for the fishery fun, officials state, and a larger crowd than last year's 500 junior fishermen is expected.

In addition to fish that will be caught in the stocked reservoir at the John Hudspeth home ranch, numerous prizes will be given.

Adding to the day's festivities will be beefburgers, with meat to be furnished by the Oregon Cattlemen's Association, and candy bars expected to be furnished by Prineville grocery stores.

Trophies will be given to the champion boy and girl anglers, based on skill at fishing, a general knowledge of the sport and good sportsmanship.

Hours for the derby will be announced at a later date.

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'Oregon call' to bring Lodge to convention

PORTLAND (UPI) — If Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge receives a "clear call" in the Oregon presidential primary May 15 he probably will return home before the Republican National convention, a campaign official said Monday.

Paul Grindle, national director of the "Draft Lodge for President" committee, said this was "the feeling of people working for Lodge's nomination."

Grindle and other Lodge workers attended the opening of Oregon state Lodge headquarters in a vacant downtown Portland store building. It was presided over by George "Bun" Stadelman, chairman of the Oregon committee.

Stadelman is a prominent fruit grower and packer at The Dalles and a former all-American football player at the University of Oregon.

He said if Lodge tops his New Hampshire write-in victory with another win in Oregon "he will be unstoppable at the national convention in July."

He said Lodge would "run better against President Johnson than any other Republican."

"Johnson will not be beaten on domestic issues," Stadelman said. "The decision will be made on the basis of capability in foreign affairs. And here Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge has no peer."

Grindle and David Goldberg, field director of the Lodge forces, said no one would speak for the ambassador during the Oregon campaign. Emphasis will be on direct-mail contact with voters and spending was estimated at around \$35,000, less than one-tenth the estimates for the Nelson Rockefeller campaign.

Faculty to get fellowships

EUGENE (UPI) — Two members of the University of Oregon faculty Monday were named to receive Guggenheim Foundation Fellowships for the 1964-65 academic year.

They are Dr. Melvin J. Cohen, associate professor of biology, and Dr. Christof A. Wegelin, associate professor of English.

Dr. Cohen will spend the year at Oxford University in England, where he will do research into the nervous system and the development of connections between nerves and muscles.

Dr. Wegelin will take his year in Switzerland, where he will study fiction dealing with the confrontation between Americans and Europeans. He plans to write a book based on the research.
