

Demonstrators draw barbs as hearing ends

PORTLAND (UPI)—A four-day hearing by the Subversive Activities Control Board ended Friday with a Justice Department attorney criticizing "attempts to discredit" the session.

James A. Cronin Jr., an attorney in the department's internal security division, said he was "amazed at the extent of attempts to discredit these hearings by stirring up mass demonstrations and misleading the general public."

About 30 Portland college students demonstrated against the hearings and the McCarran Act, under which the board was formed, outside the federal courthouse for the fourth day Friday. About 400 turned out Tuesday for what board members called the largest demonstration they had seen.

The board was attempting to determine if Norman Haaland, 69, and Benjamin G. Jacobson, 42, should be required to register as members of the Communist Party.

"Never in my experience have I witnessed such a concerted effort on behalf of respondents and others to cloud the true issues," Cronin said in his concluding remarks.

He said the attempts began when he arrived in Portland March 31 and included circulation of rumors that the public would be barred from the courtroom, that passes would be issued to people hostile to the two men, and that the respondents would not have the right to cross-examine witnesses.

The courtroom, which seats 85, was limited to that number on a first-come, first-served basis.

Defense attorney Nels Peterson countered that the hearings penalized the two men without a judicial trial. He contended penalties against the men could go as high as \$7 million.

The board, headed by former Arkansas Gov. Francis A. Cherry, gave opposing attorneys 21 days in which to file proposed findings.

Haaland and Jacobson were identified as members of various Portland Communist clubs by two paid informers, John B. Rellly and his wife, Norma.

Their usefulness to the Federal Bureau of Investigation has ended with their testimony, assistant Portland FBI chief Mount C. Dulinsky Jr. said Friday. They had worked as undercover agents since 1956.

A film about the seminary, "Promise for Tomorrow," will be shown in connection with the family night potluck dinner which will begin at 6 p.m. Sunday.

The three-hour University of Oregon course, while primarily designed for teachers, is open to the public.

Butcher union pickets barred

PORTLAND (UPI)—A restraining order was issued in Federal Court Friday barring a butchers' union from picketing grocers in the Oregon Independent Grocers' Association.

The order was issued by U.S. District Judge John F. Killenby pending a decision on whether the court has jurisdiction in the case.

Attorneys for the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers' Union, AFL-CIO, challenged the jurisdiction of the court to rule on the petition.

The hearing was continued on both the jurisdiction and the petition. The petition alleges that Local 324 of the union was picketing store association members in an attempt to coerce the association into paying 10 cents an hour for each employee into the union's pension fund.

First readings for two ordinances granting franchises to Bend Garbage Company and Blevens Sanitary Service will be given at Wednesday night's formal commission meeting. A second reading of an ordinance regulating garbage and rubbish disposal and collection will also be given at that time.

Morse says time runs out on civil rights

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Two senators split Friday over the possibility of civil rights violence with one predicting Negroes were ready to die to get what they want and the other warning that talk of violence would breed violence.

The exchange took place between Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., and Sen. Jack Miller, R-Iowa, as debate on the civil rights bill moved through the 11th day.

Morse said time was running out for action on the bill. He said congress would "pay a terrific cost... unless you stop dodging and weaving and pass this bill."

Terming the civil rights crisis the most dangerous since the Civil War, Morse said he believed "tens of thousands of Negroes were ready to die for their rights."

Miller said he thought the danger of violence was being encouraged by constant warnings that there would be trouble if congress did not pass the civil rights bill.

He urged both senators and civil rights leaders to halt their steady stream of predictions that a wave of rioting would be triggered across the nation unless a strong civil rights bill is passed.

"If the Senate is to be reasonable to all sections of the country," Miller said, "it cannot be pushed and shoved."

He said the talk of violence is backfiring for civil rights supporters. According to Miller, "The cause of the Negro is being harmed when the threat of violence is waved in the Senate."

In a long speech opposing the bill, Sen. John Sparkman (D-Ala.) said that "of all the minorities, none have been worse than the Indians." However, he said, "I have never heard the proponents of this bill advocate anything for the Indians."

Sen. Strom Thurmond (D-S.C.) agreed and said it probably was because "there were not enough Indians to throw an election" in any state.

Weekly health report issued

Thirty-seven cases of measles were reported in Jefferson County this week according to the Tri-County Health Department. Seven cases of influenza and one case of strep throat were also reported.

Deschutes County reported 13 cases of influenza, five cases of pneumonia, and two cases of scarlet fever.

Boise Cascade buys pulp, paper plant at St. Helens

ST. HELENS, Ore. (UPI) — Sale of Crown Zellerbach's St. Helens pulp and paper operation to Boise Cascade Corp. in compliance with a federal anti-trust order was announced Friday.

The sale resulted from a Federal Trade Commission order which Crown Zellerbach fought for 10 years. A federal court has upheld the order.

The initial transfer includes all Crown holdings in the St. Helens area except the timberlands and a tissue machine. The latter will be sold to Boise Cascade at the end of five years.

Purchase price for the initial package was \$26 million plus inventories. The timberlands and tissue machine will be transferred from another \$16 million.

The St. Helens properties include two bleached specialty paper machines, a large tissue machine, paper converting facilities, pulping operations and \$117,000 acres of timber in Oregon and Washington.

Crown has owned and managed the mill since 1953 when it acquired the former St. Helens Pulp and Paper Co. The FTC filed the anti-trust action almost immediately.

President Peter T. Sinclair said that during the five-year transition period, Crown Zellerbach will continue to buy a substantial portion of the output of the St. Helens operation.
