Funeral services will be held Monday at 2 p.m. at Zachary's Chapel, with the Rev. Lawrence Ferguson, Madras, officiating. Burial will be in Juniper Haven Cemetery at Prineville. Born July 1, 1874, in Cleaton, England, Mr. Dee came to the United States at the age of 12, and settled with his parents in the Grizzly area. He was a farmer there and near Madras until his retirement.

Preceded in death by his wife, Nellie, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Manila Wilson, Randolph, Ariz., two sons, Dewey, Ocean Park, Wash., and George, Madras; seven grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.

WARSAW, Poland (UPI)—Construction workers Wednesday unearthed nearly 100,000 homemade detonators for Molotov cocktails near the Warsaw Ghetto where Jewish residents battled Nazi troops in 1943.

The detonators were glass tubes filled with explosives used to ignite the gasoline-filled bottles hurled against tanks. The Nazis razed the Ghetto.
