Romney offers center location

CORVALLIS (UPI) — Vice Chancellor Miles Romney recommended today that a graduate center in Portland be located near Portland State College.

Romney told the State Board of Higher Education that the center possibly could even be part of the Portland State College complex.

The Oregon Senate ordered the board to "establish a quality program of graduate education in the arts and sciences in the Portland area" and to request the money from the next legislature.

Dr. Romney said, "No single (college or university) can meet the total graduate research and study needs for the Portland area." He said optimum development of the center "will require an integrated state system program drawing upon whatever of the system's resources can be brought to bear."

He said the "nucleus" faculty could be augmented by professors from Oregon and Oregon State and that personnel also could come from the medical and dental schools as well as private industry.

Search goes on for crash signs

VALDEZ, Alaska (UPI)—The search continued today in Prince William Sound where an Air National Guard C-123 crashed, apparently killing the four men aboard, including the adjutant general of the Alaska National Guard.

The twin-engine transport plunged Saturday night into the frigid waters shortly after Gov. William Egan and a party of 12 had been set down here for a survey of damage done by the March 27 earthquake and tidal waves.

Aboard the plane were Maj. Gen. Thomas P. Carroll, 45, the Alaska guard's adjutant general, and the plane's three-man crew, Lt. Col. Thomas E. Norris, 45, the pilot; Maj. James Rowe, 39, the co-pilot, and T. Sgt. Kenneth Ayres, 28, the flight engineer. All lived at Anchorage.

Egan warned Carroll that the general should spend the night here because of poor flying weather. But Carroll jokingly shrugged off the warning and the ill-fated plane took off in a heavy snowstorm. It crashed about three minutes later. Search boats found no sign of survivors.

No name left at crash scene

Approval sought for radio relay

PORTLAND (UPI)—An application was filed with the Federal Communications Commission today seeking approval of a new \$16 million microwave radio relay long distance route to link the Northwest with major population centers of the United States.

The application was filed by Pacific Northwest Bell and the Long Lines Department of American Telephone and Telegraph Co.

Gov. Mark Hatfield was present at a news conference when the proposal was announced. He hailed the proposal as added recognition of Oregon's and the region's growing importance in an economic and industrial sense.

Zane E. Barnes, vice president and general manager of Oregon operations for the telephone company, said the firm's expenditure would be in addition to the \$72 million it estimated last January it would spend during 1964 for construction and expansion of telephone facilities in the region.

The new long distance system would have an initial capacity of 600 simultaneous two-way calls from Portland-Seattle to eastern cities via Boise. Ultimate capacity of the new route would be 6,000 voice channels.

Microwave relay stations in Oregon would be located near Vale, Brogan, John Day, Dayville, Mitchell, Grass Valley, Antelope, Maupin, Pine Grove, Government Camp and Boring.

The announcement said the route had been carefully selected for diversification to insure that vital government and military communication channels would continue to function in event of natural disasters or military emergencies.

Construction of the radio relay buildings and associated towers would provide jobs to some 500 Northwest craftsmen. It was announced this would mean a total payroll of an estimated \$1,650,000—\$150,000 in Idaho, \$500,000 in Washington and \$1 million in Oregon. The system will take about a year to complete after approval is given by the FCC.

The basic building design of the repeater stations will be a reinforced concrete structure with slab floor and build-up roof.
