

Twitter bans Trump, citing risk of violent incitement

Twitter banned President Donald Trump's account Friday, citing "the risk of further incitement of violence" following the deadly insurrection at the U.S. Capitol on Wednesday.

Twitter has long given Trump and other world leaders broad exemptions from its rules against personal attacks, hate speech and other behaviors. But in a detailed expla-

nation posted on its blog Friday, the company said recent Trump tweets amounted to glorification of violence when read in the context of the Capitol riot and plans circulating online for future armed protests around the inauguration of President-elect Joe Biden.

The social platform has been under growing pressure to take further action against Trump following the Wednesday violence. On Thursday, Facebook

suspended Trump's account through Jan. 20 and possibly indefinitely. Twitter merely suspended Trump's account

for 12 hours after he posted a video that repeated false claims about election fraud and praised the rioters who

stormed the Capitol.

Trump's Twitter persona has long functioned as a mix of policy announcements, often out of the blue; complaints about the media; disparagement of women, minorities and his perceived enemies; and praise for his supporters, replete with exclamation marks, all-caps, and one-word declarations such as "Sad!"

The White House did not respond to a request for com-

ment. Twitter declined to make CEO Jack Dorsey available and had no further comment.

The official account for the President of the United States, @POTUS, remains live. In fact, Trump, who issued a statement Friday evening that denounced Twitter as an enemy of free speech and floated the idea that he might build his own "platform," also posted it on the @POTUS account, where it was quickly deleted.

Jackson Garrett Fromdahl — the only alleged attacker older than 18 at the time — appeared Friday before Deschutes County Circuit Judge Beth Bagley, who granted him conditional release from the Deschutes County jail, where he's been held since his arrest Dec. 10.

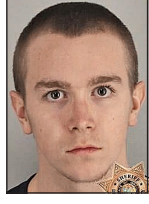
Fromdahl, 18, is to remain on house arrest at his mother's house and wear an ankle monitor throughout his case. As a further condition, he is forbidden from contacting the other defendants in any way.

Fromdahl faces seven felony

counts, four for conspiracy and one each of attempted robbery, attempted kidnapping and attempted assault. He has no prior criminal history.

A 16-year-old co-defendant was investigated for attempted murder and other crimes, according to a search warrant affidavit, but because he's a minor, other records from his case are sealed to the public.

The plan was hatched in the fall in a Snapchat group that said Duvall "is going to die," court records state. The teens in the group shared rumors the victim had assaulted a 13-year-old girl, court records show. But Duvall has not been charged with a crime connected to the rumors. Deschutes

County District Attorney John Hummel did not immediately respond to a request for further information.

The five alleged plotters reportedly agreed to ask Duvall to go "mudding" with them near Mayfield Pond off Alfalfa Road. After driving there, Fromdahl would use a hard cast on his arm to "smash" Duvall in the back of the head to incapacitate him, according to the search warrant affidavit.

The teens would then beat him up and film it, bind his arms and legs

with duct tape and leave him there.

On Dec. 10, the group took Duvall and his girlfriend to Mayfield Park. Seven people squeezed inside an older Subaru.

Two girls stayed in the car as five males walked down a dirt road at the park. One of the co-defendants, the 16-year-old boy investigated for attempted murder, ran up behind the victim and stabbed downward on his shoulder with a steak knife, puncturing his lung, court documents state. At this, the group panicked, ran to vehicle, kicked out the victim's girlfriend and fled.

Duvall and his girlfriend called 911 and went to the park entrance, where

a good Samaritan assisted in treating his wound until medics arrived.

A Bend Police officer pulled over the Subaru on Hamby Road near U.S. Highway 20 with all five teenagers still inside.

Fromdahl reportedly told police that as the alleged plotters drove away from the park, "everyone was yelling and freaking out."

The 16-year-old reportedly said he couldn't believe he'd just stabbed someone.

"(He noted) he hadn't even gotten an adrenaline rush from it," according to police.

Middle and high schoolers will start a two-day-a-week hybrid schedule Feb. 2 and remain on it indefinitely.

This plan differs from other local school districts, such as Bend-La Pine Schools, who are staggering school reopenings by grade level. Redmond originally planned to stagger

its reopening as well, but realized it would be simpler logistically to open all schools at once, Cline told The Bulletin.

This announcement came about two weeks after Gov. Kate Brown ceded control of school reopenings to local school districts.

Previously, the state set strict reopening standards for much of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Redmond students will return to classes a week before middle and high school students in neighboring Bend-La Pine Schools, but a week after that district's K-3 students.

Students are returning on a Tuesday because that Monday will be used as a curriculum prep day for school staff, the release stated.

Redmond schools will

follow state-mandated COVID-19 guidelines, including requiring face masks, social distancing and more. Students who refuse to follow these rules will be moved back into online learning, the release stated.

"We don't feel we can put either our staff members or our students at risk," Cline said of enforcing COVID-19 rules. "If they're going to be

in the building, they're going to need to follow the regulations."

Cline warned that if case counts among Redmond staff and students spike before Feb. 2, the reopening date could be pushed back.

"We're paying close attention to the case counts," he said. "Please wear a mask."

Stephanie Oster, mother of a senior at Redmond High

School and a fourth grader at M.A. Lynch Elementary, said she was extremely excited that her children would return to in-person learning soon.

"I think it shows that all of these people really wanted to get kids back into school, and that's what's important," she said. "Hats off to Redmond School District."
