WORLD CUP SKIING

Swiss skier Beat Feuz wins 2nd Kitzbühel downhill in 3 days— For the second time in three days, Beat Feuz triumphed in a race that he had unsuccessfully tried to win for a decade. The Swiss skier won this weekend's second men's World Cup downhill on the Streif course Sunday, repeating his victory from two days earlier. The back-to-back wins came after Feuz, who first raced here in 2010, finished runner-up in the traditional race four times in the past five seasons. "It's very special. Two wins in Kitzbühel this week, that's incredible, and an incredibly nice feeling," Feuz said. No Swiss skier had won Austria's signature ski race since Didier Cuche earned the last of his five victories here in 2012. Sunday's race was interrupted for a few minutes because of flat light as low clouds moved in just before Feuz was set to start.

Gut-Behrami wins tricky World Cup super-G on home course— Lara Gut-Behrami mastered a tricky World Cup super-G on Sunday where several top racers were caught out at two jumps. On a picture postcard 27 degree day in the Swiss Alps, home favorite Gut-Behrami finished 0.93 seconds faster than Tamara Tippler. Federica Brignone, the defending overall World Cup champion, was 1.02 back in third. Five of the top 20 highest-ranked starters skied out or were disqualified, including Sofia Goggia who won downhill on the Mont Lachaux slope the previous two days. Gut-Behrami now has 14 of her 28 career World Cup wins in super-G, which demands speed, technical skills and an ability to improvise through unfamiliar gates. Unlike in downhill, racers do not train on the exact course-setting.

GOLF

Si Woo Kim holds off Cantlay to win The American Express— Si Woo Kim birdied two of the final three holes to finish a rock-solid, 8-under 64, coolly rallying past late-charging Patrick Cantlay by one shot to win The American Express on Sunday for his third PGA Tour victory. Kim began the final round with a share of the lead as he attempted to win for the first time since the 2017 Players Championship. The 25-year-old South Korean didn't flinch when Cantlay shot a 61 and surged out of 13th place to the front while breaking the Stadium Course record by two strokes.

Korda rallies to beat Kang in playoff at LPGA opener— For Jessica Korda, the Diamond Resorts Tournament of Champions was all about her ability to just hang in there. Trailing by three shots headed to the back nine at Four Seasons Golf and Sports Club Orlando on Sunday, she first caught Danielle Kang with a late four-birdie burst to shoot 5-under 66, then won with a curling 30-footer for birdie on the first playoff hole. Kang shot 68. The leader after each of the first three rounds, she had a chance to extend the playoff, but missed her 18-foot birdie putt. It was the sixth LPGA victory for the 27-year-old Korda, her last one coming nearly three years ago.

"They were missing two big pieces so we know it is going to be a different team the next time we face them," Tinkle said. "We could have laid an egg thinking this game was going to be an easier game, but I am happy with our guys for staying focused and humble."

BIG PICTURE

Oregon State: After losing 98-64 at home to Arizona last week, the Beavers have rebounded with three straight wins to move above .500 in conference play. Oregon State sits in seventh place in the Pac-12, but just one game out of fourth. "We have come a long way these past three games," Thompson said. "From the start of the season where we were losing close games or getting up in games and not being able to finish out, this team has matured and come a long way."
Oregon: The Ducks had just eight scholarship players available. They hope to get Duarte and Figueroa back when they go on a three-game trip to Los Angeles next week.
