So they brainstormed, eventually deciding to add "BLM" in big, bold, silvery sequins to the left sleeves of their leotards. The fact it's the same sleeve the Panthers use when they huddle and break as a team isn't a coincidence. They believe the image of more than a dozen arms of athletes of various races leaning in together is a powerful one, particularly for sophomore Ciara Ward, one of two active Black gymnasts on the team. "They wanted to support me as a Black athlete," Ward said. "At the end of the day, they wanted to speak out against what they know is wrong." Ward remembers watching the 2012 Summer Olympics when Gabby Douglas became the first Black woman to win an all-around title. That victory resonated with Ward, then a 12-year-old growing up in Maryland who wondered how far the sport could take her. "Personally I would say (gymnastics) is a predominantly white sport," Ward said. "Sometimes when you don't see representation, you feel like you can't do something." Watching Douglas have Olympic gold draped around her neck changed Ward's whole
