Meanwhile, Oregon (13-7) is sputtering amid three losses in its last four games and could be without point guard Te-Hina Paopao this week due to an unspecified foot injury.

"Now it's our turn to improve," Oregon coach Kelly Graves said. "We need to step up and play better. It's a new season and we've struggled. We've had our struggles, especially down the stretch here. We got to find a way to right the ship a little bit."

"I'm still confident; I'm forever optimist. I really feel like we can but at some point we've got to actually do it. Right now we're guaranteed two games: One in Vegas and one in San Antonio and we'll see if we de-

serve to play more in both." A second straight conference tournament title and third in the last four years is still possible for Oregon, but with the way the last three weeks have gone it would be getting way ahead of itself to start dreaming of cutting down nets. The Ducks shot well from

three in Sunday's loss to OSU, though Taylor Mikesell took half of Oregon's 12 attempts, its second-fewest of the season. Sedona Prince also scored a career-high 22 points to go with five rebounds. Those are the things UO has to look to build off of, while also improving its defense,

which is coming off allowing a season-high 88 points and has fallen from 23rd nationally to 69th in the last five games. "I for some reason believe that... it's going to click and we're going to play better basketball when it counts here," Graves said. "We're in the (NCAA Tournament) field — I'm not worried about that; but we want to get in the field with a little bit of momentum. I think people forget a few years ago when we made our first run here we lost the two games at home going into that (Pac-12) tournament and then got a nice win against Washington up there in the second round and then took off from there. "I'm hoping that we still have that kind of a magical run left in us."
