OSU men's basketball announces Chol Marial signing

— Oregon State men's basketball filled one of its available scholarships Monday with the announcement that 7-foot-2 center Chol Marial has signed with the program for the coming season. Marial, from Rumbek, South Sudan, played the past two seasons at the University of Maryland. He averaged 1.6 points and 1.1 rebounds last season while playing 6.2 minutes and making one start in 18 games. Resistance to the Olympics in Japan is still running high with 70-80% opposed in recent polls. Fans from abroad have already been barred, and organizers have put off until as late as June a decision on having any fans at all at Olympic venues.

Taro Kono, the minister in charge of vaccination in Japan, suggested earlier this month that empty venues was a probable option.

IOC President Thomas Bach last week said his plans to meet the torch relay in Hiroshima on May 17-18 are still not confirmed. Bach's arrival would be just days after the latest state of emergency ends on May 11. Opposition lawmakers in

Japan's national legislature have suggested Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga scheduled the state of emergency to accommodate Bach. The government and the In-

ternational Olympic Committee have said the precautions are in place specifically for Japan's "Golden Week" holiday, which begins on Thursday.

The torch relay, which began on March 25 in Fukushima in northeastern Japan, has been detoured several times this month and was forced to run in an empty city park in Osaka. It was also rerouted in Matsuyama City Ehime prefecture. It will be banned altogether

this weekend on the Okinawa island of Miyakojima. The small island has only one hospital. The relay will run through other locations on Okinawa.

The heavily sponsored relay is a caravan of more than a dozen cars and other vehicles festooned with advertising from major sponsors like Coca-Cola and Toyota. Torch runners — there are 10,000 in total — typically bring up the rear amid blaring music and banter from DJs.

The relay is scheduled to end at the National Stadium on July 23 for the opening ceremony of the Tokyo Games.

Damian Lillard's struggles Lillard is mired in a horrible

slump. For the month of April, he is shooting 38.3% from the field while averaging 22 points per game. On the season, Lillard is at 43.7% and 28.5 points per game. Lillard offered no excuses

but he has suffered a long list of injuries this season. Abdomen strain, knee contusion, hand, hamstring, ankle, etc. "The only thing I could do

is look in the mirror at myself, evaluate myself," Lillard

said. "I'm just not playing well enough. I don't think it's worth going into what goes into it or anything like that. I'm on the floor and I'm just not playing well enough. If we're going to be better, I know that our team's success is parallel to me being better and I just haven't played good enough." Lillard missed three games

with a hamstring injury before returning Wednesday against Denver. Earlier in the season when CJ McCollum and Jusuf

Nurkic were out with injuries, Lillard had to carry a huge burden. But he said fatigue is not a factor.

Showed up and fizzled

Robert Covington went 0 of 7 from the field and finished with two points but he did have eight rebounds.

Little, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson and Derrick Jones Jr. combined for 18 minutes off the bench and produced just one point on a free throw from Hollis-Jefferson.

More than a few evaluators questioned the Seahawks after they traded up to select punter Michael Dickson with a fifthround pick (No. 149) in the 2018 NFL draft. Dickson went on to earn first-team All-Pro

and Pro Bowl honors in his rookie season. The Seahawks also selected defensive back Tre Flowers with a fifth-round pick (No. 146) in the same draft. Flowers has started 37 games during his career.

Arguably the most impressive selection by the Seahawks under Carroll and Schneider

has been running back Chris Carson. Carson was a seventh-round pick (No. 249), just five picks from being "Mr. Irrelevant," the final selection of the 2017 draft.

Carson has rushed for at least 1,000 yards during the 2018 and 2019 seasons, the first Seattle player to post to back-to-back

seasons of at least 1,000 yards since Marshawn Lynch. Carson agreed to re-sign with the Seahawks earlier this month, inking a two-year contract worth up to \$14.6 million to stay in Seattle. The contract includes a voidable third year that would push the overall value of the contract up to \$24.6 million.
