## Versatile technique

The "loser-on-loser" play (my topic this week) is a versatile technique in declarer's arsenal, useful in suit establishment, avoidance or — as in today's deal — executing an end

Against four hearts, West led the ten of spades: queen, king, four. East continued with the ace and jack, and declarer ruffed high and drew

South could have led a diamond toward dummy's queen next, but he judged that East, who had bid strongly, held the king. So South took the A-K of clubs, ruffed his last club in dummy, led dummy's last spade and discarded a diamond.

#### LAST DIAMOND

East was stuck. If he led a diamond, South would let it ride to the queen. If East led a spade, South would discard his last low diamond as dummy ruffed. Making four.

Note that South took care to cover West's ten of spades at Trick One. If he carelessly plays low from dummy, East will signal with his lowest spade, and West can break up the loser-onloser end play by shifting to the ten of diamonds.

#### **DAILY QUESTION**

You hold: ♠ 9 4 ♥ A Q 10 9 3 ♦ A 5 2 ♣ A K 6. You are the dealer. South in today's deal opened one

heart with this hand. Do you agree with that call?

ANSWER: I do. Many players would be willing to suppress the five-card major suit and open 1NT (15 to 17 points), but this hand is worth more than 17. It has primary values and a heart suit with strong intermediates. If partner responds one spade to your one heart, you can jump to 2NT next.


