

OF 'THE BOLD TYPE' ON FREEFORM

You know, it's so funny. I did not expect it at all. I called and asked for it – I was like, "Come on, guys, I really need this" – but I was very surprised. I don't want to spoil anything, which is really hard to do. I have some great spoilers that I could say!

I think this season as a whole finds all three of the girls starting to come into their own. Kat specifically is moving into this space where she's tapping into her personal power and using her privilege to create more change, and to overcome some of the challenges and fears that have held her back.

How was it to film the final episodes of "The Bold Type" during the coronavirus pandemic?

It was a very different world. We got shut down at the same time as the rest of the planet, so we came back to a process that was unlike anything that any of us had ever experienced.

There were so many new aspects to just being on the set, which is a high-stress environment anyway. It was intense, but in general, I felt this overwhelming sense of gratitude that we had the opportunity to come back and finish the show in a way that was intentional. You don't always get that.
