



The company announced this year that it planned to hire hundreds of people to staff the new stores.

The Factoria store "has hundreds of employees," Hass said in an email. "This number is similar to our other Amazon Fresh Stores and comparable to other major grocers.

Amazon has not yet an-

nounced a date for the opening of the Central District store, and declined to say whether that store would also have cashierless technology. Though not much of that store's interior is visible from the sidewalk, glimpses inside indicate that its shelves are close to fully stocked.

In Washington state, in addition to its two Amazon Fresh grocery stores, Amazon also operates six Amazon Go cashierless convenience stores, 11 Whole Foods locations and a handful of other physical retail storefronts, including Amazon Books and Amazon 4-star stores.

New listings: The 3,971 Portland metro area homes introduced to the market in May marked a 2.3% decrease from the 4,065 new listings in April, according to the latest listing service report. Last month's new listings marked a 16.1% increase from the 3,419 new listings in May 2020.

Pending sales: In the Portland metro area, the 3,717 homes that received an accepted offer in May signaled a 9.3% increase compared to April and a 19.4% spike from May 2020, according to the report. Closed sales: In May, 3,183 residential properties in the Portland metro area were sold — an increase of 8% from the 2,946 that closed in April, and a 62.1% jump from the 1,963 closings in May 2020, the report shows.

Time on the market: The average time Portland metro residential properties were for sale last month before receiving an acceptable offer dropped to 22 days.

Delta Air Lines Inc. is more than 20% behind pre-pandemic capacity and United Airlines Holdings Inc. is more than 30% below. American didn't immediately comment on the difference.

American and other airlines have had trouble matching their desire to offer flights with their ability to assemble crews, although it expects to complete training for furloughed pilots by the end of June. The airline said it dropped

flights in markets that have other options for passengers and is working to make schedule changes in advance of travelers' departure dates.

Southwest Airlines Co. canceled about 200 flights Monday — the most among U.S. carriers, according to tracker FlightAware.com — and 30 more on Tuesday ahead of summer storms that were expected to push across much of the U.S. South and Northeast, including the New York City area, Washington and Philadelphia, a spokesman said. About 480 Southwest flights, or 13%, were delayed Monday, FlightAware data showed, fol-

lowed by 12% at American. U.S. carriers have struggled to match the supply of aircraft and crews with soaring demand for air travel. The seven-day average number of passengers exceeded 1.9 million for the first time since the pandemic, according to Transportation Security Administration tallies of people going though security at U.S. airports.

While raw passenger counts have been climbing steadily as infections and deaths fall, the trend coincides with the traditional increase as the

summer travel season approaches. As a result, the number of people flying has remained at about 73% of 2019

levels, including for all of June. "We're just seeing a rocket ship straight up to where we were prior to the pandemic domestically," said Dennis Tajer, an American captain and spokesman for the Allied Pilots Association. About 1,000 American pilots retired early or left the airline voluntarily during the pandemic as U.S. carriers sought to reduce headcount to match gutted demand.

American's scheduling system,

which has long been a sore point between the carrier and its pilots union, hasn't kept up with the expanded schedule, he said. "We're disappointed that management is surrendering to reducing the schedule rather than working with APA to create solutions to fly the schedule."

Aviators who have been concerned about American's viability have encouraged the airline to "be aggressive" with allowing willing pilots to pick up overtime flying, Tajer said.

The airline didn't immediately comment on the union's claim.

Curaleaf had its own CBD line and didn't buy Cura's CBD brand. So Cura insiders launched a new company, Sentia Wellness, built on the new Social CBD product line. Regulatory filings indicate Sentia had raised \$91 million, but it immediately ran into setbacks.

Sentia laid off 30 of its 150 staff members less than five months after its launch, blaming uncertainty over

how federal health regulators would treat CBD. The Portland company was later sued by its landlord when Sentia sought to cancel its lease for its Pearl District headquarters, and by an Italian chocolate company that accused Sentia of backing out of a deal to buy manufacturing equipment. Court records indicate Sentia set-

tled the dispute with its landlord, but the \$2.2 million suit over its manufacturing equipment remains active.

Prosecutors didn't charge Khanna, saying that while DNA evidence

showed he had sexual contact with the woman, they couldn't prove it was nonconsensual. Khanna settled a lawsuit the woman brought in 2014 without disclosing terms of their agreement.

Khanna stepped down as CEO of Cura, the Portland marijuana company, in 2018 after women active in the marijuana community highlighted the past allegations against him. He remained the company's executive chairman, though, and engineered its sale to Curaleaf.
