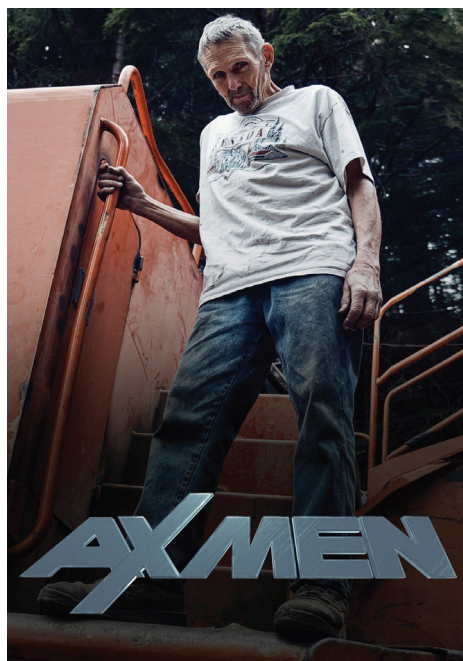

Back in the day, Saturday nights were prime viewing on the networks and “The Love Boat” was appointment television.

Indeed, the adventures of Captain Stubing, Julie, Gopher, Doc and Isaac in the 1977-86 ABC romance-on-the-high-seas comedy made for feel-good viewing for America. So when the opportunity arose to co-host the unscripted series “The Real Love Boat” with wife Rebecca Romijn, the self-admitted reality TV junkie didn't have to think twice.

He just wasn't prepared for the emotions that he experienced as he followed the romantic adventures of contestants on the Wednesday CBS series.

“Our first episode, someone gets eliminated in our sailaway ceremony,” he explains. “And I – I didn't cry, but I was emotional. And it was explained to me by my superiors that I am a host, therefore, (impartial), and I cannot be so invested. ...

“I can't speak on behalf of my wife,” he continues, “but I was shocked at how emotionally attached I became to our couples and how much I was rooting for them. ... It became an emotional journey for me.”

In the series, singles well-versed in the ups and downs of romance try to find love aboard the Regal Princess as the ship sails the Mediterranean to exotic ports of call including Barcelona, Santorini, Athens and the French Riviera. Staffers try to assist the process.

As for O'Connell, he had never been on a cruise prior to making “The Real Love Boat” but he says he understands its appeal and how life at sea can be conducive to love.

“When you have days at sea, it's really like time stands still,” he says. “I mean, I get it. I get Jack and Rose (the ‘Titanic’ movie characters) now. I get it all.”
