A Remarkable Tooth.

The temple at Yakadama, Japan, contains a wonderful relic in the shape of a tooth which, tradition says, one of the gods pulled from his jaw in order to have a weapon with which to dispatch an immense ebra, says the St. Louis Republic. Years ago, according to the tradition, after the tooth had been worshiped by heathen devotees for centuries, a change of sentiment took place in regard to the relic. It was declared to be a fraud and was, accordingly, ground to a powder and then thrown into the river. But the particles came together, so the priests say, and again formed themselves into a perfect tooth which was found as perfect as before the ordeal, quietly reposing in the bed of the river. After this miracle, the "Temple of the Sacred Tooth," which had also been destroyed by the unbelievers, was rebuilt and the tooth again enshrined as an object of adoration. At present it is kept in a gold box wrapped in films from the sacred white spider's web.
