#### His Brain Destroyed.

San Francisco, Cal. 28 - William Kennedy, the well digger who was pinned to the bottom of a 60-foot Dry Goods well last Friday by a crowbar which fell from the surface of the ground and penetrated his brain, and lived to tell how it happened, died in great agony, in the city and county hospital last night.

How Kennedy lived at all after the accident is a puzzle to the phy-Notions, &c. sicians. When the wound was laid open by Autopsy Surgeon Morgan fully one-third of the brain had escaped through the great hole made by the crowbar, and the remainder was badly decomposed. The point of the heavy crowbar had penetrated the skull just over the right temple, passing through the skull her everyday talk would fill a good in the rear, fracturing the bone in a Lundred pieces.
