Or rather is it the base contemptible politician instigated by the money power, that stands on every street corner and hurrahs for the flag, with the basest intentions at heart and a Mark Hanna love for his country and its republican institutions?

Taking into consideration that means of money in times of election, are used and not for legitimate purposes together with coercion, intimidation and fraud. Is the result, when obtained in this way, the voice of a free people? Then what is the situation of our boasted self government?

In view of the elements combined against him, Mr. Bryan's election could be almost miraculous. Still there are thousands, aye millions who believe that he will be elected, whether elected or defeated, his campaign will go down in history as one of the most magnificent feats against difficulties ever con-

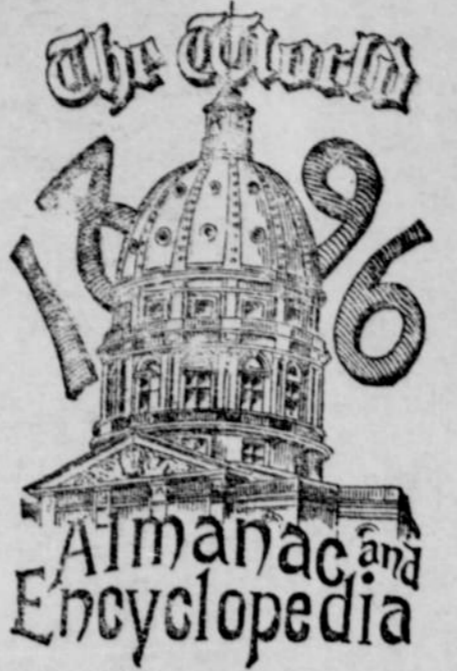
