

"Old Forked Foot."

Floods In France.

PARIS, Oct. 30.—Heavy storms and floods have occurred in South-western France. The river Rhone has risen to such an extent that it has overflowed its banks in several places.

Rogamaure, Becauaire and Velabregue have been inundated and the ancient amphitheatres and casino have been flooded. The inhabitants of Velabregue are living for the time being in the upper stories of their houses.

Great anxiety is felt concerning the condition of affairs at Avignon, lower portions of which have been flooded. The valleys of the Saone and the Ardeche have been inundated by the torrent of rain.

The upper district of Cevennes has suffered great damage. A part of Auxerre has been inundated, and food has to be taken to the inhabitants from outside districts by boats. Numerous small towns in France report more or less extensive floods and loss of property.
