

County Court Proceedings.

The following are the proceedings of the county court since our last issue:

D. J. Kennedy admitted as a county charge.

Jury list drawn for the year 1897.

Semi annual settlement with the treasurer showed total amount received on general fund from July 1 to Dec. 31, 1896, \$12,487.29. Paid out on liabilities of this \$8,230.18, balance on hand in said fund \$4,248.11 available for the payment of outstanding warrants. Total amount received on school fund \$3,747.13, paid out to the various school clerks upon the order of the superintendent, \$3,167.34. Amount received on road fund \$3,913.06, disbursed upon warrants drawn on said fund, \$2,355.97, on hand \$1,557.10. Total amount received on building fund \$3,870.85, disbursed on warrants drawn on said fund \$1,824.17 balance on hand \$2,046.68. Total amount received from the town of Burns \$112.99 paid to city treasurer \$101.07, on hand \$11.92

Semi-annual settlement with the sheriff for the six months ending Dec. 31, 1896. Amount collected on taxes \$3,331.04 and paid the same to the treasurer.

Geo. W. Thompson appointed road supervisor for district No. 9.

Treasurer ordered to redeem four of the Grant county warrants now due.

W. R. King of Baker City was employed as additional counsel on the Gittings bond case at the cost of \$300.

The west line of district No. 8 located on the line between Tp 32 1/2 and 33 E.

Road district No. 14 established beginning at the SE cor. Tp 21 S R 34, thence north on range line to NE cor. of said Tp, thence west to SW cor sec 34 tp 20 S R 34, thence north on sec line between sections 33 and 34 tp 20 S R 34 to a point where said line crosses the middle fork of the Malheur river and thence up the east bank of said river to where the line of sec 5 tp 20 R 34 crosses said river, thence along the line the NE cor sec 5 tp 20 S R 34, thence west to the NW cor said sec thence north to the NW cor sec 29 tp 20 S R 34, thence west to NW cor sec 30 tp 20 S R 33 thence north to NE cor sec 1 tp 19 R 33 thence west to the NW cor sec 6 tp 19 R 33 thence north to the SW cor sec 31 tp 21 S R 33 thence east to place of beginning.
