This road has been wanted by the citizens living in the southern portion of Burns for several years, as they think it will have a tendency to build up their section of the town, which we think will be a case, and in fact we are sure it will benefit the whole place, because it will invite other businesses to locate in that section, and instead of an injury it will be a public good and benefit.
