

Extra Session Called.

Washington, March 6.—The president has issued the following proclamation:

By the president of the United States of America—A proclamation:

Whereas, Public interests require that the congress of the United States should be convened in extra session at 12 o'clock on the 15th day of March, 1896, to receive such communication as may be made by the executive.

Now, therefore, I, William McKinley, president of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim and declare that an extraordinary occasion requires the congress of the United States to convene in extra session at the capitol in the city of Washington on the 15th day of March, 1896, at 12 o'clock noon, of which all persons at that time entitled to act as members thereof are hereby required to take notice.

Given under my hand and the seal of the United States at Washington the 6th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-first.
