#### Union Silver Party.

The following is an outline of a platform that has been submitted as a basis of union for the reform and silver elements of this state:

We demand the free coinage of gold and silver as primary money of full debt paying power at the ratio of 16 to 1. A sufficient volume of treasury notes issued directly to the people.

We demand economical state and county administration, and entire abolition of the fee system.

We demand a primary law that will enable each voter, in a county, to express a direct choice between the candidates for nomination on the ticket he expects to vote.

We demand a registration law that will ensure honest elections without depriving the citizen of any of his political rights under the constitution.

We demand the restoration of the mortgage tax law so framed as to allow exemption for recorded indebtedness only.

We demand abolition of commissions, a maximum freight rate and passenger fares reduced to three cents a mile. The free pass system, as a means of political corruption should be abolished.

We demand the election of United States senators by direct vote of the people, and such changes in the constitution as will enable the people to originate legislative reforms, and also refer back to them all matters of importance in the commonwealth.

We demand a change in the method of amending constitution that shall be more speedy and not defeat all efforts at amendment as does the present system.

As the producer cannot stand an extravagant system of government and politics, coupled with an expensive system of finance and taxation, we demand public control and regulation of all monopolies on land and water that are virtually a tax on the producer, and ownership of any such as are not amenable to the legislature and the courts.

We appeal to the people to take the government into their own hands and out of the hands of the professional spoils politicians and the representatives wealth created by special privileges.

Jacksonville Times: The management of the Portland public library has excluded the San Francisco Examiner, New York World and Journal from its rooms on the ground that the matter they furnish is not for the advancement of the morality and intelligence of its patrons. Such a display of goodness is amusing, if not downright ridiculous. While given to sensationalism, the boycotted papers are considered by best judges as being in the front rank of journalism.

The building stone industry over in the vicinity of Elk City is growing. The Pioneer quarry has always had a market for all the stone the force could turn out, and now the quarry of Arthur Rodhester, in the same vicinity, has closed a contract for supplying a San Francisco firm with all the stone that can be quarried, says the Corvallis Times.
