County Court Proceedings

Viewers appointed to view the road up Silvies river at the March term filed report, allowing J. E. Martin damages to the amount of \$5, and road ordered opened.

A liquor license granted to A. I. and R. B. Johnson of Drewsey, for six months, beginning with May 5 and ending November 5, 1897.

Road tax of A. Robbius apportioned so that road district No. 14 receives 10 days work and No. 6 receive 3 days work.

Supervisor of road district No. 4 ordered to ascertain the true distance from the guide board at the forks of the road leading to McKinney & Sparrow's mill and E. H. King's mill and correct the guide board.

It appearing to the court that D. J. Kennedy, a county charge, was able to earn his own support, he was discharged from the poor farm.

Geo. W. Smelser was taken as a county charge.

Henry Stevens, Henry Scoubes and H. E. Layton appointed as viewers, and V. Deffenbaugh as surveyor to meet on Monday the 7th day of June, 1897, and proceed to view, layout and survey a road petitioned for, beginning at the

month of Skull creek canyon in Catlow valley to terminate at the residence of A. Denio in Pueblo valley.

In the matter of a road of public easement through the lands of the French, Glenn Live Stock Co. to the residence of Edward Lee Oliver, it was ordered that A. W. Hulbert, Simon Lewis and J. T. Ware be appointed as viewers to meet at the house of Ed L. Oliver on the 27th day of May 1897, and proceed to lay out said road.

J. W. Biggs, attorney for the First National Bank of Baker city, filed an application for the repayment of taxes wrongfully assessed to and collected from said Bank. The court examined the assessment found that \$7.15 had been collected on property not belonging to the First National Bank and the clerk was ordered to draw a warrant for the amount.

Peter French, the cattle king of Oregon, was in town this week from his extensive ranches.—Huntington Herald.

An interesting story is told of a young man who recently rode from Omaha to Portland for only \$6.25. At the beginning of each division he bought a ticket for a few miles and then borrowed the long distant tag of a man having a ticket, when the conductor passed acting as unconcerned as a nabob.

Superintendent Paine, of the state insane asylum, has filed his report for the month ending March 32, and it shows 775 males, 363 females total 1138, as against 1110 last month, under care and treatment.
