100,000 head of sheep will be sheared at Huntington during the present season. That little city is seeing good times this spring.

The machinery for the Vale, Malheur county, flouring mill has been purchased. The mill will have a capacity of 50 barrels a day.

Matthew, an educated Indian boy, was almost killed by a bear on Mission creek, 15 miles from Lewiston, Idaho, last week. The boy had recently returned from school, and was in company with a wheelman out hunting for grouse with a 32-caliber rifle. The dogs found a cinnamon bear in a den

under a clump of trees, and held it at bay till the hunters, from curiosity, approached. The bear, a female with cubs, made a rush for the young Indian. The boy ran, but seeing escape by flight to be impossible, turned and fired the little gun full in the bears face. The slight wound only enraged bruin. She sprung up on the boy and bore him down and began to tear him with teeth and claws. The cloths were torn from the prostrate boy, and the flesh was fearfully lacerated.

The white man came to the rescue. He was armed only with a little 22-caliber rifle. He poured the little bullets into the bear from short range until the beast took flight and left the boy. The boy was unconscious. The flesh was torn in shreds from his arms, and he was pierced with the sharp teeth in 50 places.
