## OREGON.

The origin of the word Oregon has been subject of considerable controversy and it is impossible to arrive at a certain conclusion in regard to it. It was printed for the first time in Carver's Travels in 1778 as the name of a great river of the west and was referred to by Bryant in his famous "Thanatopsis."

A hundred years ago there were five nations claimed Oregon, which then included Washington, Idaho and a part of British Columbia. Spain maintained a claim to this section by right of discovery said to have been made in 1543. Russia claimed that her sailors had explored the coast down past the present limits of the state where they held a fort with a large garrison.

The United States based its claim to the state on 1. Discovery by Capt. Robert Gray in 1792 2. Louisiana Purchase in 1803 3. Clark's expedition in 1805 4. Settlement of Astoria 1811 5. Florida treaty in 1819.

Oregon covers about 96,000 sq. miles of territory. It is as large as New England and Indiana combined. Eighty states the size of Rhode Island could be carved out of Oregon and almost enough would remain to equal the area of Delaware and Connecticut combined. Oregon is twice as large as England and if as densely settled would have a population of 40,000,000 people.

Oregon is naturally divided into two parts; Eastern Oregon lying east of the Cascades is a plateau with an average elevation of about 2500 feet. This section includes about two-thirds of the state and is well adapted to agriculture and stock raising. Western Oregon extends from the Cascades to the Pacific and comprises the Willamette valley with an area of about 9,000 sq. miles. This is one of the most productive lands in the world being rich in fruit and grain. One-half of the population and seven-tenths of the wealth of Oregon is found in the Willamette valley.

Politically the state is divided into 32 counties, the largest of which is Harney with an area of 10,600 sq. miles and a population of 2,600 people and Malheur whose area is 9,937 sq. miles and a population of about 2,700. The area of Harney county is almost equal to that of Belgium and equals to two-thirds of that of Switzerland. Multnomah county is the smallest county only having an area of 449 sq. miles. Its population is about 30,000. Marion county has an area of 830 sq. miles and 23,000 inhabitants.

The Columbia, with its tributaries, constitute the drainage of the greater part of the state. This noble river has cut through the Cascade range and affords wild and beautiful scenery. The Multnomah Falls along the Columbia descend 850 feet in a straight band of white water and forms one of the most picturesque and beautiful falls in the world. The Columbia drains a basin of about 495,000 sq. miles and the main stream is navigable for 725 miles with interruptions. It is navigated within 450 miles of the Missouri and 350 miles of the Yellowstone.

Mt. Hood is the highest mountain peak in the state; it was discovered by Lieut. Broughton of the Royal Navy and named after Lord Hood who was prominent in the English navy at that time. This peak was believed to be from 12,000 to 14,000 feet high until 1862 when the military survey, under Col. Willson, found its height to be 11,223 feet above the level of the sea.

Among the other remarkable peaks is Mt. Jefferson, 10,200 feet high, and the Three Sisters which are the fragments of a huge crater wall.

Crater lake, Oregon's National Park, is the deepest body of fresh water in the United States, its sounding passing 2,000 feet. It is one of the wonders of America.

\*Agriculture is the principal pur-

port of the people of Oregon. Wheat is the leading staple and the average yield of the Willamette Valley is 17 bushels per acre. Oregon has produced about 15,000,000 bushels in a single year. In 1893 17,000,000 bushels were harvested.

The product of oats is over 6,300,000 bushels and that of hay is over 730,000 tons. The production of hops has grown wonderfully in the last few years, one crop for 1893 was 15,000,000 lbs. The fruit industry is increasing and produces 1,100,000 bushels of apples annually, and 200,000 bushels of peaches and plums. Potatoes are extensively raised in different parts of the state, the annual product being 3,500,000 bushels. About 5,000,000 pounds of butter and cheese are made every year which would average 15 lbs. to each inhabitant of the state.

The wool industry is of great importance, Oregon having about 2,500,000 sheep which produce about 10,000,000 pounds of wool.

The fisheries of Oregon are very important. More salmon are canned in Oregon than any other state in the Union.

In years past, as high as 600,000 cases of salmon have been caught. As each case contains 48 one-pound cans there would be about 14,000 tons caught in a year. In 1894 there were 511,000 cases caught on the Columbia river.

There are about 30 canneries in operation, and during a prosperous season about 7,500 boats are engaged in the industry.
