The San Francisco Call of Monday said:

There's to be mule express between Dyer and faraway Dawson during the coming winter, and it will be the famous old pony express of yore California days.

At least this is the brilliant scheme which C. H. DeWitt of Woodland and John Roberts, partner and part owner of the steamer Enterprise, are starting to carry through. Mr. DeWitt is a man of means who owns a large stock ranch in Harney Valley, Or. A year ago he moved to Woodland, Cal., to educate his children and when the Klondyke fever struck the Sacramento Valley he was one of its victims. Several Woodlanders have joined the rush, by the way, one of them being Landford Terrence of the Capital Hotel there.

"We propose," said Mr. DeWitt yesterday, "to at once establish stations fifteen or twenty miles apart along the whole route, having a man and sufficient supplies at each station. Fifteen or twenty miles will be all a mule and driver will want to make in a day and there will be a change at each station.

"I expect that we will use dogs for about 125 miles of the way, and that will be determined when I get there. I have arranged to ship 25 more mules from Seattle the steamer's next trip. We are taking in nearly two years' supplies, and have plenty of capital. I expect to go clear through to Klondyke this fall, but I do not expect to get through before the lakes and rivers freeze. We will put our way along and establish stations as we go. I consider the route a feasible one and expect to make it a success. I expect to look out for other investments in the country at the same time."

DeWitt's mules have a chance to be made as mules never blessed the world before. The impossibilities of the Farallou mule Arctic express defy reckoning.

The teals used in putting the rap on blankets and cloths in the Portland Woolen mills are grown in Oregon and are becoming a much sought after article by Eastern woolen mill operators. The Portland Oregonian says A. J. Sawell of Astoria, Clatsamas county, has just finished harvesting his crop of teals from the 100 acres he had planted in that crop this year. He estimates that he will have 12,000,000 teals for sale. Mr. Sawell has made a business of raising teals for a number of years, and used to be the only man in Oregon in that business. With the exception of a small field in the same neighborhood, these are the only teals raised for the market outside of New York state. The Oregon teals are much larger and better than those raised in New York, and find a ready market among woolen manufacturers in the East. Mr. Sawell supplies the Pacific coast demand for them, and ships a large quantity East, though the freight to Eastern markets somewhat handicaps him.

As there are probably some people who do not know what a teal is, it may be stated that it is the burr or flower head of the "beet plant," or "tule," herb which grows in seed, and is covered with soft, pearly scales or bristles which are used for putting the rap on woolen goods. The rap with these scales is much stronger and more durable than the rap made of twisted wool which is now used. The scales are gathered from a weed which grows in swamps, and are gathered under it, coming in contact with the sharp hooked points, which tear the fibers of the wool, and make a rap on it. Many persons have endeavored to find some machinery to take the place of the teal, but nothing ever made has been found to answer the purpose at all.
