The San Francisco Examiner of Sunday had a symposium on the question, "How to become a Successful Lawyer."

Among those participated in it were ex-president Cleveland, ex-Attorney-General Garland, Chauncy M. Depew, Roger A. Pryor and others. What they all say will be accepted as generally true, but what they all say makes plain the fact that there is no royal road to success as a lawyer.

Mr. Cleveland, not an eminent lawyer nor a successful one as the term is generally understood, though the prestige he had gained as president no doubt brought the law firm of which he became a member on retiring from the White House the first time much practice, says:

In the practice of law, as in everything else, honesty and frank, fair dealing is not only enjoined by good morals, but is the best policy. It is a delusion to suppose that the noble profession of the law can be faithfully pursued or successfully practiced by trickery and over-reaching subterfuges.

Ex-Attorney Garland, who has certainly been a successful lawyer, says:

If a young lawyer wishes to be a successful one he must continue his professional studies with just as much care and unremitting attention after he has been admitted to the bar as he did when a student, in the ordinary acceptance of that term, making and preserving notes of his reading; attending when possible, proceedings of an important character in courts; reading anything outside of law that may aid him in practice; adhering to the law for itself and not as an object secondary or auxiliary to something else, and making his client's course his own, without reservation, and rendering his first and last duty to him.

General Roger A. Pryor, who has earned the right to speak authoritatively on the subject of how to become a successful lawyer, says:

To be a successful lawyer incessant, lifelong study is essential. I think that one obstacle to obtaining success at the bar is the eagerness of the young lawyer to get into practice. Long ago Lord Coke deprecated premature practice, because when a man is engaged in practice he cannot pursue his courses of systematic study. The lawyer who gets early into full practice can never be a great lawyer. To be a great lawyer he must become such substantially before he is engaged by practice.

Success in the law, or in any other profession or business, may not come with work, but it never will without work; and with that work there must be tenacity of purpose, definite aims which must never be abandoned, but striven after always. It is just as hard to tell a young man how to achieve success in law as how to make a fortune. But this symposium by distinguished men has not improved on the old saying, which is applicable in the present instances: "There is no excellence without labor."

Cryus C. Babb, United States general inspector of the hydrographic surveys for the district west of the Mississippi, says the Deschuts river contains the largest volume of water, for the area drained by it, of any river of what is known as the arid, or semi-arid region. While on the way to Prineville he measured the discharge of water at the Deschuts ferry, near the ashey, and found it to be 440 cubic feet per second. This volume of water is sufficient to irrigate 445,000 acres, or 10,000 acres for every cubic foot.

Mr. Dabb gave The Dalles Times-Chronicle the following measurements of discharge of the Deschuts at various important places, and also those of six of its tributaries.

At the free bridge, seven miles above the mouth of the Deschuts, the flow per second is 5562 cubic feet; at the agency ferry, 5452

cubic feet; at Sizemor's bridge, below the lava flow, 1921 cubic feet; at Lave postoffice, above the lava flow, 1780 cubic feet; White river, at Tygh, 192 cubic feet; Warm Spring river, at the reservation road crossing, 284 cubic feet; Tygh creek, 24 cubic feet; Crooked river, 57 cubic feet; Prineville irrigating canal, 4 feet; Tummalo creek, 85 cubic feet.

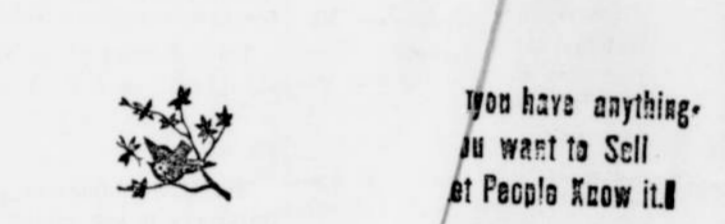

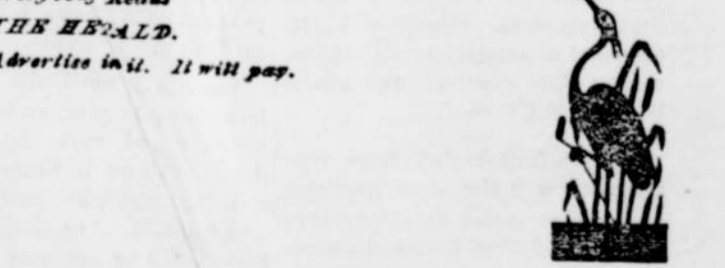
