The prices of green and roasted coffee are now lower than ever before. Rio No. 7 on the spot is quoted at 6 1/2 cents a pound. The market on futures has also gone down 15 points, owing to the steady increase in the visible supply in the United States, which is larger than ever before in the history of the trade, being more than 1,000,000 bags. The price of green coffee a year ago was 20 cents and that of roasted 16 1/2 cents. The margin between the two varieties has therefore been reduced from 3 1/2 to 2 1/2 cents. In other words, cut in two.

The price of roasted coffee in packages as sold by the Arbuckles and the Woolson Spice Company has fallen to 9 cents a pound. A representative of the Arbuckles is quoted as saying that this price is below cost, and a representative of the Havemeyers, who control the Woolson Spice Company, says there is a profit in 9-cent coffee.
